## Update from Suffolk County Council Consultations

There are currently two consultations in progress, a budget consultation, and the libraries consultation.

#### Flooding

During the recent storms 24 areas across Suffolk were highlighted as being affected by flooding, Hundon, Clare and Cavendish were highlighted as being the worst affected areas.

On Wednesday, Communities Secretary Michael Gove and Environment Secretary Thérèse Coffey announced a number of financial measures to support those who have experienced exceptional localised flooding.

Under the measures announced:

• Flooded households in affected areas can apply for up to £500 to give cash quickly to help with immediate costs.

• Households and businesses significantly affected by recent flooding will be eligible for 100% council tax and business rates relief for at least three months.

• Small-to-medium-sized businesses in affected areas will be eligible for up to £2,500 from the Business Recovery Grant to help them return quickly to business as usual.

• Eligible flood-hit property owners will be able to apply for up to £5,000 to help make their homes and businesses more resilient to future flooding via the Property Flood Resilience Repair Grant Scheme.

The support will be made available through a scheme known as the Flood Recovery Framework, which is used in exceptional circumstances to support councils and communities following severe flooding.

The full details of the scheme are yet to be announced by the Government, including where residents can apply and who is eligible. Suffolk County Council will share updates once received.

#### HUNDON SPORTS ASSOCIATION "THE ASTRO"

There has been an increase lately of youngsters who are not entitled to be using the astro climbing the fences and gate or attempting to reach through and use the gate release button on the inside. This is extremely dangerous as the fences are not designed for climbing on. They are high and flimsy at the top and a fall could result in serious injury.

We are required to take measures to prevent climbing in this area and to that end an anti-climb paint has been re-applied to the perimeter fencing and gate above the level of normal reach and to areas where they may try to reach through. People will only come into contact with the paint if they are attempting to gain unauthorised access. This substance is not harmful to skin although it is hard to get it off and it will ruin clothes.

For those with youngsters of an age where they play out unsupervised can I ask that you speak to them and encourage them not to climb the astro fencing or gate.

It is possible to have a family membership of the Astro which costs £65 a year and allows use of the pitch at any times where it is not block booked for group activities. For further details please contact me on <u>stewartalderman.sa@gmail.com</u>.

• Peace is not the absence of conflict, but the presence of God.


• Peace is not a feeling, but a state of being. Peace is not something that we can achieve on our own, but something that we receive from God.


From the references to her northern upbringing to the comical connotations and innuendos, her story was hilarious, but also heartwarming and inspirational.



### CHRISTMAS AT THE CASTLE



One of the Park's most striking features is the 62 foot high Norman motte that formed part of Clare Castle. The Castle was at its heyday in the 14<sup>th</sup> century, when it was the principal home of Elizabeth de Burgh, Lady of Clare. Granddaughter of King Edward I and niece of Edward II, Elizabeth had been widowed three times by the age of 26 and lived a good proportion of her remaining 38 years at Clare Castle. Immensely rich, she was an influential patron of the arts and books and a generous benefactor, endowing Clare College Cambridge and Clare Priory, among other establishments.

So what would Christmas at the Castle have been like for Elizabeth and her household?

It would have begun on the night of Christmas Eve and lasted until Twelfth Night on 6 January: there were no Christmas ads in October in medieval times. The Great Hall in the Castle's inner bailey would have been festooned with holly and ivy and warmed by a tree trunk (the "yule log") burning for the 12 days of Christmas. Fresh rushes would have been laid on the floor. Most food was eaten with fingers, but Elizabeth's table would have been set with knives, spoons (there were no forks for another 200 years) and thick slices of stale bread as plates for the meat.

The aristocracy might exchange fine clothes and jewellery on Christmas Day and New Year's Day, but the big event was the Christmas Day feast. Nut roast would not have been on the menu. Instead the feast provided a rare opportunity for the poor to eat meat and a less rare opportunity for the rich to show off, with delicacies such as boar's heads on a platter and a swan or peacock roasted in its feathers.

As one of England's wealthiest women, Elizabeth's kitchen accounts for Christmas Day 1326 show that her household consumed 3 swans, 2 herons, 2 bittern, 2 egret, 6 capons and 18 doves and woodcock, as well as 2 heads of boar, a stag, 5 deer and numerous other animals including pigs, sheep, calves, piglets, geese, hens, pullets and partridge.

The swans and doves would have been reserved for the VIP guests along with the 34 gallons of wine, but lower status guests and members of the household would have eaten and drunk well and the castle servants would have enjoyed goose, chicken and ale. Leftovers were given to the paupers who waited outside for offal and anything else going spare. (Offal was known as the "umbles" in medieval times, hence the term "eating umble pie".)

Turkey was not on the menu as Europeans were yet to discover the Americas, nor would they have tucked into a tin of Roses after dinner, as chocolate was unknown in England until the 1600s.

The household would have enjoyed dancing to music from pipes, flutes, lutes and drums, along with drinking and general merry making. On a cold day the moat and fish ponds would have provided the opportunity for skating, using skates made from the shin bones of horses.

Today we can only imagine the sounds, smells and revelry of those great Christmas feasts. However, Elizabeth's legacy lives on in the institutions she endowed and in the remnants of her former home. Standing at the top of the motte in midwinter, with the moat and medieval Clare spread out below, it isn't hard to conjure up echoes of those long ago pipes and to imagine Christmas at the Castle, medieval style.
