ALLOTMENTS UPDATE DECEMBER 2016

The Rogeron Trustees and Mr Smith (our Land Agent) wish you all a Happy and fulfilling New Year, with many happy hours on the allotments.

As you are aware, a lot of work has been done on the allotments this year, which has helped make the field a more pleasant and safer area. Very many thanks to all the allotment holders who have spent time tidying their plots and ensuring that these are used for growing purposes, or as grassy areas for relaxation – it is a pleasure to see this happening. It also means we have fewer worries about health and safety risks or the problems of the dumping of such eyesores as building materials and rubbish.

Rubbish etc

Mr Davis has cleared several piles of rubbish, burning where necessary. The next stage is demolishing and burning any sheds which are in a dangerous state; known owners have had letters to warn of such occurrence. Where we have no contact details (such as abandoned plots where people have moved on) the sheds will be demolished. In addition, anyone who has dumped building materials on their plot has had at least one letter to give notice that they will have to clear the offending materials or lose their plot. We have done this as health and safety has been stepped up due to insurance concerns. It also helps to make the allotment field less unsightly.

Ditches

North/south: The grass and undergrowth has been cleared, which has allowed the rest of the ditch to be dug out from beside 29 Rogeron Close to the bridge on Lower Road. The lower part of this ditch is the responsibility of Suffolk County Council, but we felt it was better for us to have the work done, as we didn't want a pile up of water at the end of "our" ditch.

East/west: Much clearance work has been completed and the ditch has been partially dug out. We DID check for hedgehogs before the work was done (no sign), but have left plenty of habitat for them. We now need to have the larger saplings cut back, so that the digging out can be fully completed. Hopefully Suffolk Housing will soon have the culvert sorted out!

All this work should help to avoid the flooding difficulties.

Hedges and trees

Track off Church Street: The hedge between the track and footpath has been removed which will ensure the footpath is safer and more accessible, aid maintenance of the hedge beside the ditch, let in more light and make laying pipework for the tap easier. We also wish to tidy up the hedge between the footpath and ditch. A fence has been put in the form a safety barrier between the footpath and track.

Farmerie Road: The hedge around the footpath from Farmerie Road will be trimmed back to allow easier access for pedestrians. We will continue this cutting back from the footpath, alongside the allotments beside 54 Farmerie Road, up to the top corner of the field. Bottom end of the field: We are going to cut back the larger trees from behind the Housing Assoc properties and at the rear of 51 Farmerie Road, as some are in a dangerous state. We will also cut back some of the saplings and larger trees along the watercourse. Cutting back at both of these areas will aid water flow and, hopefully, prevent flooding. As mentioned before, the western end is far more difficult due to health and safety reasons (pond, very wet land, very difficult access) but we are working on this. We will need planning permission for most of the work on the trees as the field is within the Conservation Area.

May we remind home owners that they are allowed, in law, to cut down any branches which overhang their properties. These can be kept by the home owners (firewood) or returned to the allotments.

Security

Metal bollards will be put in on the allotment field to stop vehicles and caravans etc coming onto the allotments from Rogeron Close. These will be at least a wheelchair width apart, so pedestrian access is not blocked. On the Church Street access there will be a locked barrier from the end of the fence to the rear of the Brewster's property. This will have a key code lock with the number being given to all registered allotment holders.

Finally we should like to give an enormous "Thank you" to Messrs Davis and Basham who have spent many hours on the allotments (clearing back, cutting, demolishing, burning, planning, creating......) and to Mr Smith for all his help, advice and support. Gentlemen, we couldn't do without you!!!!

FROM THE REVD STUART MITCHELL AT THE VICARAGE IN CLARE

Dear friends,

From the introduction to the United service for the Week of Prayer of unity in Clare Parish Church 15 January; This year many Christians will be commemorating the anniversary of the Reformation in Germany. As Luther discovered himself reconciled to Christ by faith, we remember that God has reconciled us through Jesus Christ whose love compels us to be ministers of reconciliation. We give thanks that through the reformation which established the many varieties of Christian witness some of which are represented here today, we have come far from the divisions that separate us and work towards that which unites us. Today we offer ourselves once more to the redeeming work begun in Christ, praying for his continuing forgiveness, by our own actions and the world which is his. The English Reformation left an outstanding legacy, begun by Archbishop Thomas Cranmer, in the Book of Common Prayer. This single volume remains the cornerstone of all worship; it contains the central belief of the Anglican Church and yet would prove to be so divisive to our ancestors in their understanding of God's mission in a broken world.

Ever since the reformation there has always been a desire, for some to somehow be untied, to be one with each other as well as one in Christ. Unity in the church (ie the Body of Christ) is something that is a long way off; but progress has been made in recent years. At least conversations between the leaders of the denomination take place frequently - in this part of Suffolk. All Christian denominations share a Creed that begins something like 'We believe in God...' We share a belief and acceptance in the Holy Scriptures, the root of which in the English Language comes from the work of theologians in the 17th century. And that is a good thing but as all denominations report a falling adherence of faith and belief in God is it not time to set aside our differences to genuinely share all that we hold in common? The joy shared in the service last month, which acknowledged our failings that keep us apart, that were symbolically broken down in the love of Christ should be seen as who we are and not what we are. My thanks to all who shared with me, that same love in Jesus that everyone should be able to experience.



HUNDON PARISH COUNCIL Village Matters

Hundon Parish Meeting was held on Wednesday 18th January 2017

Hundon Church:

The church roof repairs have now been completed. Also, the installation of a new sound system, with a hearing loop for the hard of hearing has been installed. Donations were made from many parishioners to whom the church is eternally grateful.

Graffiti:

Many thanks to Pete Smedley who has offered to clean the graffiti off the many signs around the village. Also many thanks to those of you who reported this to me and Gill Shepstone.

Speeding:

As many parishioners, will be aware, speeding through our village has been up for discussion on many occasions. The Parish Council have decided upon the following action, in order to try and ease this problem.

Forms have been completed requesting TVAS (Temporary Vehicle Activated Signs) to be positioned in and around Hundon. These signs, when triggered display the speed limit red roundel sign with **SLOW DOWN**. The signs are deployed by the Council at each agreed site for two weeks, two or three times a year. An assessor will need to establish whether the sites chosen are suitable. A request for funding has been raised with Suffolk Council to help with the cost of these signs. The sites chosen were Lower Road, Clare Road, 2 in North Street and Church Street,

Along with the signs, speed awareness wheelie bin stickers have been purchased. These will be distributed to houses where the TVAS have been proposed. Please stick these on your bins when they arrive. We are not suggesting that bins are kept out 24/7, however we feel any little thing that reminds drivers of the speed limit through our village can only help.

FEBRUARY CHOLANGIOCARCINOMA MONTH

FEBRUARY 15TH WORLD CHOLANGIOCARCINOMA DAY

Most people will be asking what is Cholangiocarcinoma? It is an insidious cancer of the bile duct. It is underfunded and under researched. In 2013 it claimed 2,161 lives in England alone. Worldwide it is on the rise, but interest is not keeping pace with this fact and progress is stalling at the same time.

People affected by this cancer commonly refer to it as CC. I found out the hard way when my wife, Sue, succumbed to cholangiocarcinoma on December 1st 2015. During her life Sue underwent various operations on her legs, including two knee replacements. For her last twenty years Sue had to contend with Type 2 Diabetes.

As if she had not contended with enough Sue was diagnosed with CUP (Cancer of Unknown Primary) early in 2013. She broke all the survival rules, had numerous CAT scans, underwent seven months of chemotherapy in 2015, before surviving a serious bout of pneumonia.

In mid-November Sue was back in WSH to have excess fluid removed from her abdomen. The junior doctor detected jaundice around her eye. An ultra sound showed her bile ducts were blocked and an MRI scan two days later confirmed bile duct cancer. Less than three weeks later Sue had died. Since then I have discovered five families affected by CC within a twenty mile radius of Hundon.

I had hoped to have established an international charity for medical undergrads to study and research CC in countries other than their own by now, but I have had my own health issues over the last couple of months and this has unfortunately delayed my project. I am hoping to be able to publish full details of the charity and its website in next month's Hundon Herald.

My son, Ian, and I had planned a domestic CC charity when we knew of Sue's diagnosis, but there was already an UK Cholangiocarcinoma charity - AMMF (The Alan Morement Memorial Fund).

Alan Morement, who lived just over the border in Essex, died in 2000 when there was basically no information about the cancer that killed him. Helen, his widow, set up AMMF in 2002. Since then the charity has been raising awareness of cholangiocarcinoma, supporting patients and families, and raising funds through donations to support research. So far AMMF has passed over 500K to research projects.




