

BROXTED SOLAR COMMUNITY FUND FOR HUNDON

APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING - 2017

As most of you will know, Broxted Solar Limited, which operates the Solar Farm at Broxted, has very kindly created a special fund for the benefit of Hundon - the Broxted Solar Community Fund ('the Community Fund'). The Awards for funding in 2017 will be made in the late Summer and Applications are now being sought.

The main features of the Community Fund are summarised: -

Funding in 2017 – as in previous years - will be £10,000. It is anticipated that this will rise to £10,500 in 2018.

The sum of £10,000 will include a direct annual payment of £1,500 to Hundon School

The balance of £8,500 will be awarded to organisations or groups within Hundon. To receive an award from the Community Fund, an application must make a material change or create material benefit for the Community in and around Hundon, and may include revenue items as well as capital payments

The minimum award through the Community Fund will be £1,000 as any applicant must demonstrate 'material change' or 'material benefit' for the Community i.e. not narrowly focused or small in size or scope. Inevitably, not all applications will be successful

The Community Fund is run by the Community Fund Group. At any one time this will consist of four members:

The Chairman or Representative of the Parish Council - currently Geoff Spooner

The Chairman of the Village Hall – currently Bob Barnett

One other representative of the Hundon Community with wide knowledge and experience of it - the first such representative member being David Rowlinson

A representative of Navigator Land LLP, the owners of Broxted Estate (and hence landlords of Broxted Solar) - the first such representative being Charles Ryder

David Rowlinson acts as Chairman of the Community Fund Group and Charles Ryder/Navigator Land LLP administers it.

Applications should please be emailed to Charles Ryder at <u>charles@gbfco.com</u>; they must be received by 30th **June.** During the ensuing two months, the Community Fund Group will consider the applications seeking, where necessary, further information. The Group will then make recommendations to Broxted Solar by 31st August as to which applications should be awarded funding and payments are anticipated to be made in late September.

Applications should either be sent in the form of a brief but succinct note or by way of a brief business plan. Please note that all Applications must be for projects which require £1,000 or more. Sadly, not all applications will be successful but such projects can apply in the following year.

The Community Fund Group looks forward to receiving Applications in the coming weeks. We very much hope that Broxted Solar's Community Fund will continue to be of great benefit to the Community of Hundon over the coming years.



UPDATE FROM THE COMMUNITY SHOP

Progress at last! Many of you will have spotted the early signs of progress with the long planned improvements to the shop. The work of tidying up the area outside began a few weeks ago with the removal of some very tired trees and bushes. By the end of March the outside groundwork should be well under way and the semi derelict cage will be history. Eventually we will see a much better organised area, with a new structure where you will find plants and other outside stuff, and a place for people to sit (and – hopefully- consume drinks, ice creams, sandwiches, cakes, sweets from the shop).

Work inside the shop will start the first week of April. The first phase mainly involves changes from the counter to the back of the shop. This will not affect our service except that there is bound to be some noise. We will keep any disruption to a minimum. The plan is to open up that area to allow more space. The advantages will become clear to customers when the second phase of work is done. This involves moving the post office counter out into the shop (similar to the new arrangement in Clare) and a comprehensive rearrangement and replacement of the shop fittings.

All this takes time because we are dependent on the Post Office and the contractors. The second phase of work will take place in July – by the end of that month we hope to have a bright new shop for you. Meanwhile we will be fully open for business as usual – please come and take advantage of the convenience of shopping in your own village. There will be a few days in July when we will have to offer a more limited service from the social club in the hall – we will keep you posted about that.

The shop committee are very grateful to the hall committee for its help and cooperation. We will continue to work closely with them and the other groups who use the hall and the space around it. We also couldn't have got this far without all the support from the village – and the hard work of the shop volunteers and Karen and Catherine. More volunteers are still needed so don't hang back if you want to do something to help – just look in for a word.

We are very fortunate still to have a small general shop and post office in Hundon. Our aim is to make the shop work better for you – and the more you use it the more secure will be its future.

FROM THE REVD STUART MITCHELL AT THE VICARAGE IN CLARE

Dear friends.

The Diocesan vision and Strategy, 'Growing in God' continues to influence all that God is calling us to do in this part of the Diocese, which is entirely in West Suffolk. But when I look across the River Stour in the neighbouring county of Essex and the Diocese of Chelmsford does it look any different to where I'm standing?

A question, in two parts I suppose, which floats about in quieter moments goes something like 'can God's call on us be separated by a stretch of water; is what we are doing in Suffolk as the body of Christ any different to the body of Christ in Essex?' The answer I arrive at is no it can't be. I have been supported in that train of thought through the Lent course in Stoke by Clare using material from 'United Society Partners in the Gospel - USPG'. The material brings five aspects of discipleship from around the world and linked to scripture. Questions have been set to stimulate conversation on the topic of Discipleship. Christian Discipleship in the modern world has a set of challenges equal too and probably harder than the first century when the weight of the Roman Empire and an often tyrannical religious leadership were against 'The Way', the phrase used to describe the followers of Jesus. The challenges in the wider world come from other faiths and to a certain extent differing views of the Christian faith. The Christian duty is the fulfilment of the command to love one another as God has loved you, but whilst we are aiming for that there has to be an acceptance of the understanding of the other person's point of view and hopefully theirs of me and you.

In the closing session the respondent from Liverpool having worked with Christians from Iran, who are prepared to stand up for their faith, says that being a Christian in the UK has replaced what used to be a way of life with a weekly meeting; a damning observation to say the least. The call to be a disciple of Jesus is an echo two thousand years old and yet the message is very clear to be heard by everyone. There is no barrier big enough to stop it, not even the River Stour, as it flows gently past the benefice to the wider North Sea. Disciples, like angels, come in all shapes and sizes it just may be you that God is calling.

Look out for the additional services in Holy Week including Compline being said Monday-Wednesday in a different church.

Hundon Parish Meeting was held on Wednesday 15th March 2016.

Primary School dog-poo competition

A competition has taken place at the Hundon Primary School, this has now been judged by our County Councillor, Mary Evans and she has commented there were some really good entries. Once the winning designs have been photocopied A3 size and laminated, the posters will be ready for display around the village. Let's hope they have the desired effect and that the many dog poo bins around the village are utilised.

Storm Doris

A big thank you from the Parish Council goes to Julian Basham who spent many hours cleaning up uprooted trees, branches etc., at no cost to the parishioners and Parish Council. Thanks Julian.

Speeding

The Poles and brackets are soon to be erected and we hope, that in the not too distant future, the TVAS machines will be fully operational. The information gathered by the machines is sent to the police and if they find that more than 12% of motorists are driving over the 30mph speed limit, then Police Officers with speed guns will visit the village. You have been made aware!

Wheelie bin speed stickers have been delivered to Clare Road, Church Street and North Street; hopefully the next tranche will be available shortly. If the stickers are not required due to some residents living in the 20mph limit (i.e. near the school) please return them to ClIr Helen Ballantyne, who will redistribute them to people who require more.

Social Care Levy

Suffolk-wide Surviving Winter Project – 63 & Over (just received)

Although the winter months are nearly behind us, you may be interested in this project which is a joint venture between The Suffolk Community Foundation and EADT.

The Surviving Winter campaign offers vulnerable older individuals respite from the anxiety of managing fuel costs and the opportunity to stay warm and healthy during the

winter. Every year, the Government provides a non-meanstested Winter Fuel Payment for everyone aged 62 and above. The Surviving Winter campaign encourages people who don't need the extra support to donate it to help those who may otherwise struggle to afford to heat their homes.

Applications are assessed against pre-set criteria and one off payments range between £25 to £200. All completed forms should be returned to Ipswich & District Citizens Advice, 19 Tower Street, Ipswich, IP1 3BE. LOCATION 56 Farmerie Road, Hundon, Sudbury, Suffolk, CO10 8HA. Planning Application - 1no. dwelling (following removal of existing garage) with associated vehicular access, as amended by drawings received 13th March which reduce the size of the bungalow from a 3 bedroom to a 2 bedroom dwelling.

Some Residents of Farmerie Road & Parish Council hold objections to the proposed planning application.

LOCATION Brockley Hall Brockley Green Hundon Sudbury. CO10 8DT. Planning Application - (i)
Conversion and extension to annexe/out-building (following part demolition) to form dwelling; (ii) 1no. 3 bay cart lodge to serve host dwelling; (iii) associated vehicular access.

The Parish Council does not hold any objections to the proposed planning application.

LOCATION Hundon Thicks Farm, Hundon, Suffolk, CO10 8DJ. Proposed installation of replacement Telecommunications Mast. Removal of existing 20m high dead tree mast and its replacement with an 18m monopole with 6 antennas and 1, 0.6m transmission link dish, 1 replacement and 1 additional equipment cabinets on existing concrete base along with ancillary development thereto. The Parish Council hold objection to the replacement of the dead tree mast.

HAVERHILL CHORAL SOCIETY

Rehearsals are under way in preparation for Haverhill Choral Society's next performance, their Spring Concert which takes place on Saturday. April 8th at Haverhill's Old Independent Church starting at 7.30 pm.

The choir of 45 together with Nigel Brown, organist, 4 soloists and orchestra will be conducted by Jane Wright, the Society's Musical Director.

The programme comprises 3 contrasting works including Zadok the Priest, a work which has been popularised by having been performed in our Coronation service since 973AD, although today's setting was arranged by Handel in 1727. Appropriately the work has been adapted from the first chapter of the Book of Kings and opens with a long introduction followed by a resplendent climax of voices together with trumpets and drums.

Haydn's "Paukenmesse" - "Mass in Time of War" is a piece composed to reflect Europe's concern over the ambitions of the young Napoleon regarding the composer's homeland, Austria, and it has been suggested that the Timpani part in the Agnus Dei provides an effective illustration of this. The remaining work is by Mozart and commissioned by the Archbishop of Salzburg who was well known as a patron and employer of the composer. Titled "Vesperae Solennes de Confessore", it was composed for Vespers which is the sunset evening prayer service known in the Church of England as Evensong. Mozart's version is made up of musical settings of 5 psalms including Psalm 117 which has been a source of great inspiration to great classical composers for centuries and features in the 5th part, "Laudate Dominum" which includes an exquisite soprano solo.

It will be a welcome return to Haverhill for the choir to perform what promises to be a delightful concert in a setting designed in the mid-19th century when such great works were so popular. At the time, Gurteens were the main employer in the town and Dan Gurteen who was then the Managing Director was instrumental in providing what at the time was an important place of worship. The O.I.C. will receive a share of the proceeds. Refreshments including a complimentary glass of wine will be provided. Tickets will be available on the door and cost £10. TROPHY HARVEST FOR TABLE TENNIS SIBLINGS



DIABETES CARE IN SUFFOLK: DO YOU KNOW YOUR FOOT HEALTH RISK?

Healthwatch Suffolk is putting feet in focus with the launch of its latest research report. It has worked closely with a leading clinician to explore the views of local patients about their experiences of accessing diabetic foot care in the county.

Figures from Diabetes UK indicate that over 100 diabetes-related foot amputations occur every week in England. Patients with diabetes should receive an annual foot examination to determine whether their foot sensation is intact and their blood supply to the feet is good but this does not always happen.

Key findings:

- 32% of the respondents stated that they were not told about their risk of developing a diabetic foot problem in the future during their last appointment.
- 43% of respondents were not told what they should do if a new foot problem had developed.
- 28% of respondents said they were not given advice about how to look after their feet.

Three things that people said could be improved about their care:

- Ensuring people are informed about the importance of maintaining foot health and their risk of developing complications.
- Improving the availability of information regarding foot health.
- Offer more regular foot health checks.

An early outcome from the project will see patients across the East of England receiving a new information card following their annual health check. The passport, which will be roughly the size of a bank card, will be carried by patients at all times and include information about what to look for in terms of their foot health and who they should contact if they have concerns.

Andy Yacoub (Chief Executive of Healthwatch Suffolk) said:

"It is clear that people are receiving good care in the county but there is room to improve, particularly with regard to keeping people involved in their care and informed of their foot health risk. It is also important to help people to understand how they can best manage and look after their health as early intervention is linked to the best possible outcomes.

"It is our hope that the findings will be used to improve services in Suffolk and to build on continued developments within local services. Our report includes a number of recommendations and we will ask health leaders to respond formally in due course."

SIR PERCY'S CHELTENHAM FESTIVAL WINNER

Sir Percy sired his first Cheltenham Festival winner on March 16th when six-year-old Presenting Percy landed the £54,102.50 Listed Pertemps Final on March 16th by nearly four lengths. If he keeps fit he will be one to keep an eye on at the 2018 Cheltenham Festival. This success will widen Sir Percy's appeal as a dual Flat and NH stallion.

Across the world he is still turning out international winners. German-bred Wake Forest, who now runs in the USA, won the eleven furlong Grade 2 McDiarmida Stakes at Gulfstream, Florida, worth £94,764.23 on March 4th. During his racing career he has won seven races, including four at black type level - two in the USA (Grade 1 and 2), and two Group 3 in Europe before crossing "The Pond". His total prize money has now passed £600,000.

Mr Scaramanga, who is trained in Great Britain, was successful on an overseas trip to Doha, Qatar, where he won a local Group 2 mile race worth £115,853.66 on February 25th. During January Sir Percy sired two winners in New Zealand.

The chance of him having a Group 1 winner in New Zealand in March was denied by torrential rain. Lord Van Percy, formerly trained by Andrew Balding, winner of five GB winners, and runner-up in York's 2014 Ebor Handicap before moving to Australia, had crossed the Tasman Sea to run in the Auckland Cup. The original fixture was postponed, but Lord Van Percy returned home without contesting the new date five days later. He was bred by the Pakenhams, owners of Sir Percy.
