First is a **Rioja** from Spain. This is an organically produced wine from a vineyard high in the Sierra Yerga mountains. It's a well balanced, medium bodied wine which will be perfect with roast turkey, chicken and pork or with grilled salmon, ideal for Christmas. The shop is selling it at £8.70.

We are also now stocking a **Chardonnay** from the Sierra Grande range from Chile. Their Sauvignon and Merlot have proved very popular with our customers. The Chardonnay is unoaked and is pure, vibrant and aromatic in style. Like the others from this range we are selling it at an attractive price of £6.99.

And – as well as the Sauvignon and the Merlot – don't forget the Beaujolais Villages which is a softer, lighter, fruity wine. We also have a Pinot Grigio, a white from northern Italy great with fish or to drink before your meal and a Montepulciano d'Abruzzo a red which is brilliant with pasta – I've proved that myself!

#### Parish magazine letter – December 2017

#### A SEASON OF HOPE from Rev'd Lynda Sebbage

When you read this, it will be less than four weeks to Christmas, and we will be well into the period of Advent. For many, Christmas shopping and preparations are under way, cards are being written, there are queues at the post office to catch the last post to somewhere in the world, and thoughts turn to what on earth we can buy for people in the family who seem to have everything. Probably by now you will already be fed up with the Christmas TV adverts, the pretty Christmas lights in the town will have been switched on, and yes - everyone will be getting ready and waiting....!

While as Christians we are not immune to the build-up of Christmas as it sweeps us along with the tide, we are preparing for more than just the celebrations the retailers would love us to buy into. Advent is certainly a period of 'waiting' – that's where the word comes from. According to my Bible dictionary, Advent means *"the arrival of something important or someone important, especially meaning the coming of Christ."* This period of Advent lasts for four Sundays before Christmas, finishing on Christmas Eve - after which we move into the period of Christmas, which ends 12 days later in Epiphany. The season focuses on expectation and waiting in anticipation for the arrival of the Messiah, of whom the Old Testament prophets foretold:

> "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." (Isaiah 7.14)


Yet that's not the only reason we are waiting, because although we are preparing to celebrate His first coming, we are also waiting for Christ's second coming - a double blessing! The Bible foretells Christ's birth, but it also foretells His coming again, when Christ will return in glory to consummate His eternal kingdom. And we therefore need to prepare ourselves for that second coming.

Advent is a season of hope, and this Christ-given hope enables us to be positive and have joy in our hearts, even when faced with all the terrible situations of this world, and despite the difficulties in our own lives. We can be assured that God's kingdom is near, and that God will not fail us.

During this Advent season, why not take the gift of God's hope to those who are in distress or trouble? Perhaps a novel and practical way to do this would be to write an alternative list of Christmas wishes. It could be something you would like to do for, or give to, a person who you may or may not know, as a sign of Christ's hope. Pray for God's blessing on that gift, in the knowledge that your gift will enable them to know something more of the selfless love of Christ.

#### A prayer for Advent:

Loving Lord, you came to us as the Christ child and you promised you will return. During this time of Advent, as we wait for your kingdom to come, enable us to use our time wisely to share the Good News with others, to help them and ourselves prepare for that day when your glorious Kingdom is revealed and we see you face to face. In Jesus' name. Amen

The Hundon Parish Meeting was held on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2017.

### Changes to dog control in St. Edmundsbury

From the 1<sup>st</sup> October 2017 Public Space Protection Orders are being introduced covering all spaces open to the public across the Borough. Allowing a dog to foul an area open to the public without picking it up could result in a fixed penalty notice of £80.00. If the fixed penalty is not paid then court proceedings could take place with a fine of up to £1000. In addition, dogs are excluded from some public areas, including play areas, and fenced sports pitches during the playing season. Communities are being asked to pass on details of any fouling incidents they may see for council enforcement officers to follow up. St. Edmundsbury have produced a toolkit which includes a report form; all information is treated as confidential.

#### Speeding - update

The TVAS (temporary vehicle activated sign) machine has been put up on the pole in North Street just down from the Rose & Crown pub. It will be moved around the village on a regular basis.

#### **Older Persons Information Fair**

This Fair will take place on the 1<sup>st</sup> December between 10.30am – 1.30pm in the Apex, Bury St. Edmonds. The object of this Fair is to learn more about what's on offer locally, how to access services, participate in community groups and unearth opportunities. Also, information is available around well-being: health, fitness, technology, safety, volunteering, crime prevention, gardening and the arts.

Joyce's experience in banking made her ideal at a time when the parish council was involved in securing loans and grants for various projects in the community. Two projects which spring to mind are the millennium project ie the all-weather sports facility, Joyce oversaw the financial side of these as they were done through the parish council, also the social club buildings at the village hall. At the time the village hall were not able to raise the funds required, so they asked the parish council for help. After a great deal of searching Joyce came up with a public works loan which the parish council could take out over a twenty year period. We do not believe the social club would have been built at that time had it not been for Joyce.

Joyce's cool temperament came in very handy when parish meetings occasionally became heated, she would diplomatically calm things down with a few calmly spoken and carefully chosen words.

We were all sorry to see her retire when she and Terry moved to Clare and it was with a great deal of sadness that we learned of her passing. Joyce was a woman who held and will always have our greatest respect.

Police are appealing to the public to be aware of a spate of burglaries in Suffolk where high value jewellery & large sums of cash have been stolen.

• Always lock all doors and windows, even if you only pop out for a few minutes

• Secure your back garden by locking gates with closed shackle padlocks and having 6ft high fences

• Do not leave tools or bricks in the garden that could be used to force entry

• Have dusk to dawn lights installed around the house

• Leave lights and a radio on timers to make your home look occupied

• Do not leave any items on display

• Avoid keeping jewellery in the master bedroom-hide this in different rooms around your home (not in the bottom of a wardrobe) Register belongings eg mobile phones, laptops, cameras & cycles on www.immobilise.com

• Consider having a burglar alarm fitted



### KEEPING IN TUNE WITH CONTEMPORARY MUSICAL TASTES

A popular local choir, Haverhill Choral Society will in future be known as the "HAVERHILL SINGERS". The choir was founded by Daniel Gurteen in 1860, shortly after Haverhill's Old Independent Church was completed and at the time choral singing was a very popular pastime.

Modern choirs have tended to broaden their programme and whilst impressive choral works such as Handel's "Messiah" and Verdi's Requiem will always be enjoyed by audience and performer, there are many opportunities to offer programmes which also reflect the wide range of today's musical genres.

The choir has staged several successful concerts over recent years including 2 in Hundon church in 2015 when Karl Orff's "Carmina Burana" was performed in April and Handel's "Messiah" in December. Other programmes have included tributes to Shakespeare and Gilbert & Sullivan.

Recently they hosted a choir from Haverhill's French Twin Town in Pont St. Esprit and presented a joint concert which proved to be a great success with great acclaim from an audience of over 100 who clearly enjoyed the varied selection of music.

Haverhill Singers has a membership of almost 60 from the town and surrounding villages including of course Hundon, and usually present 2 main concerts each year, one in the Spring and one in December.





### BATTLEFIELD TOUR TO NORMANDY MAY 2018

I am planning a tour from Suffolk to Normandy D Day June 1944 from Friday 11 May to Monday 14 May 2018. To date most of the people are working hence the long weekend. 11 and 14 May will be travel days.

This can only be a snapshot of the actual event of the Normandy landings but enough to take in both American sector and the British sector and give people the basis of the Normandy operation and the beach assault landings.

### US sector

Dependent on the exit point from UK we would certainly take in St Mere Eglise and the American airborne assault into Normandy on the night of 5/6 June, Omaha Beach and the American cemetery (this was the opening scene of the Private Ryan film and those who saw it will remember Pte Ryan, in the US cemetery overlooking Omaha Beach, on his way to visit Tom Hanks' grave). We will go to Pointe du Hoc the scene of a cliff assault by American Ranger battalion tasked with taking out a German gun battery pointing out to sea. Whilst in the area we will visit the German cemetery at La Cambe . This is particularly to show the contrast between British and American cemeteries and how the Germans honoured their dead. .

### The British sector

We will visit the site of the Merville Battery north of Caen where the British 9 PARA battalion parachuted in to take out a German gun battery overlooking the landing beaches. We will then go to Pegasus Bridge, the objective of a glider born assault, to secure a bridge to prevent German reinforcement of troops overlooking the beaches. Whilst at Pegasus Bridge we will visit the excellent museum on site . We move onto Gold beach one of the two British landing beaches and in particular cover the actions of W02/CSM Stanley Hollis, Green Howards, the only British soldier to be awarded the Victoria Cross on D Day.


Having visited one or two other local areas of interest we will end the day at the British war cemetery at Bayeux and pay our own respects to the Fallen at the Cross of Sacrifice with the laying of a wreath.

The trip will be by coach from somewhere local and we will stay for three nights at one of the several hotels I know well. On 11 May we will have an early start as wherever we go from – Dover, Portsmouth or Poole there will be a little travelling. Often some of the travellers on a Normandy tour will stay in a Holiday Inn or Premier Inn at the departure port to avoid the early start.

There is more detailed planning to include costings it would help me to know if there is anyone interested who we might wish to come on the tour . Do please contact me by email or by phone if the idea appeals. In outline we will start each day earlyish (breakfast at 7) and I will aim to get people back to the hotel by 5.30/6 in the evening. Plenty of time to crash for a bit, shower and maybe go out for dinner or at the hotel if we can get D,B&B and certainly a few glasses of vino collapso for those who want!





### POLICE CONNECT:

Police are warning that theft of lead from buildings is again being reported in Suffolk. (Elmswell Church had its lead roof stripped on 10th November.)

Rural churches, in particular, are often targeted due to their isolated locations. However, other buildings have also been targeted.

Sgt Brian Calver of the Rural Crime Team said: "Communities can act as our eyes and ears, and by making a note of any suspicious activity of people or vehicles we can deter thieves. Don't ignore anything that you think looks out of place - report anything you think may be suspicious to the police. I would also urge scrap dealers to report any attempts at lead disposal to us, as the lead from church roofs is often marked with smart water and so we can easily identify where it's come from."

Owners, staff of retail, public, and other vulnerable buildings are urged to take all appropriate measures to monitor and secure their properties in order to reduce their risk.

Measures to consider:

• Checking your roof regularly for any missing lead – early detection can allow for roof repairs before it rains and creates additional internal damage.

• Regularly reviewing your perimeter fencing and gate security - check for weaknesses which could allow access.

Installing outside lighting on dusk till dawn sensors.

· Restricting vehicle access wherever possible.

• Improving visibility by cutting back vegetation, moving bins or improving the lighting.

• Ensuring any objects, equipment or materials stored near the building do not allow easy access to the roof.

Anti-climb paint or physical barriers can be used to prevent access, but all anti-climb devices must be clearly signposted to comply with the Occupiers Liability Act 1984.

• Encouraging neighbours to be vigilant and to report any suspicious behaviour immediately.

 Using a forensic solution to mark any lead - warning signs saying forensic marking has been used should be displayed. Products can be found at <u>http://</u> www.securedbydesign.com

• Where a theft has already occurred, you should consider using lead replacement products - check with your local planning officer to see if this is allowed on your building.

Any suspicious activity should be reported immediately.

Stealing a large amount of lead takes time and a reasonably large vehicle to transport it, so any early reports will assist police in locating the offenders.

Call 101 to report suspicious activity. Always call 999 in an emergency, or if you think a crime is in progress. If you prefer to remain anonymous call Crimestoppers on 0800 555111.


