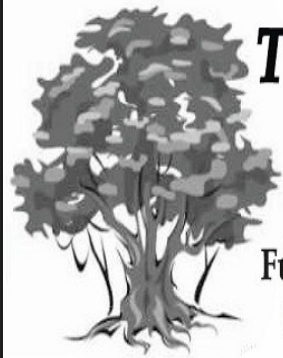

Hundon Cricket Club has a long and continuous history of playing senior cricket in the Adams & Harrison sponsored Midweek League. In recent years the club has been successful in promoting and coaching junior cricket for both boys & girls who also compete in a local junior league. The village has had a cricket club since the last war and the club is one of the many groups and organisations that make Hundon such an attractive and active community.

However, in common with many rural cricket clubs, Hundon is now facing diminishing support - we struggle to raise a senior team on a weekly basis, despite having over 30 registered players. We need to change this if the club is to survive.

So if you are a seasoned player, born again player or have never played before but would like to have a go and are over 16 then we would like to hear from you. All players are welcome, male or female, living in Hundon or one of the surrounding villages. We play in the lowest division (we can't be relegated) against like-minded teams and it's about the competing not the winning (but winning always helps!). A great opportunity to get some exercise and meet other villagers.

Hundon has a pretty little ground on Lower North Street close to the Church and Rose & Crown Pub (Camra Community Pub of the Year in 2017). We have a small friendly active group looking after the ground and recently installed a compact pavilion with kitchen, loo and changing facilities. The senior league normally plays their games on a Wednesday operating from the end of April through to July, weather permitting.

THE GRAND MIRACLE

I recently found myself in conversation with a stranger who, when she discovered I was ordained, decided to leap in to action with a whole host of questions. Whether she was testing me or was genuinely interested I don't know, but one of the questions she asked me was this: "Do you believe in the Virgin birth?" I had already batted a lot of answers back to her on a range of theological topics that required some thought, but with this one I didn't stop to consider my answer. I immediately said 'Yes'. The lady looked at me with scepticism, as I endeavoured to explain the tenets of Christ's deity and God's miraculous workings.

Mulling this over afterwards led me to think about Advent, this special time in the Christian calendar when we prepare for the arrival of God's Son. I wonder what Mary must have been feeling. Was she prepared for the impending birth? Hardly. As we know from our Bible stories, Mary and Joseph were seeking shelter in Bethlehem after making a long and exhausting journey from their hometown, Nazareth, to register for the Roman census. It was a 90-mile journey by foot and donkey, and must have been gruelling to say the least. This was not the cosy looking trip that we see depicted on our Christmas cards; this was tough. This slow journey would have taken them through dangerous areas, with bandits and wild beasts commonplace; the weather would also be against them. They would have to seek shelter each night, carry their own food, and take breaks as often as possible with Mary almost full term in her pregnancy. How desperate they must have been when arriving at Bethlehem to find there was no room for them anywhere. Mary must have questioned in her mind why God had burdened her so much – but God's hand was on them, and as we know, shelter was provided in a cave used for housing livestock and other animals. The nativity would not have been the same had they procured a comfortable room in a tavern!

The season of Advent invites us to travel that same journey in a symbolic manner: to prepare for Christmas not only in the usual heady and idealistic ways involving food, presents and other trimmings, but also spiritually. We should take the time to read the scriptures, pray and think through this marvellous gift of Jesus from God.

C.S. Lewis described the coming of Christ as a child born of the virgin birth as, "*The Grand Miracle...the Incarnation is the grandest miracle of all, which all other miracles stem from or lead up to.*" I think this is what I tried to explain to the disbelieving lady with the questions. "Yes, I do believe in the virgin birth, because it was a grand miracle, a miracle that led to many more miracles taking place. God's power is mightier than we can comprehend – all we need is faith, and as Christians, this is our faith."

HUNDON VILLAGE 2018 POPPY APPEAL

The Legion has restructured our immediate area and this year we took on responsibility for Clare and Poslingford as well. The latter not with our collectors but Peter Loup from Clare helped distributing the boxes and tins in Clare and with the counting. The aim of the plan was that we would now be able to do our own counting and banking of the money collected.

We have had a very successful Appeal this year with yet another record collection. The total for Hundon was £2358.93. Part of this was due to an excellent collection of £337.50 from the church on Remembrance Sunday, generous donations of £100 from the Parish Council, and two anonymous donations of £100, a fantastic £414.60 from collector Richard Langridge including 19 Gift Aiders – so special thanks to those who live on Richard's pitch. Most of our collectors used Gift Aid that certainly improved our overall takings. Thank you all very much indeed. I would particularly like to thank our counters David Rowlinson, Phil Impey and Peter Loup from Clare – with his kitchen scales. As some of you will know banks count totals by weighing coinage – eg plastic bags of 20 with £1 coins, a £1 bag of 100 pence, a £10 bag for 10 x 50p, etc. After coins had been counted (for the three villages) Peter weighed all our bags of cash and David and Phil staggered into Lloyds Bank in Haverhill with bags of half a CWT or so of coinage plus 'x' number of £20, £10 and £5 notes!!

Our new system does need refining in places and that will be done in good time for next year but everyone can be well pleased with the result this year.

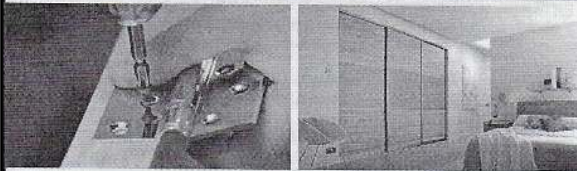

HUNDON HAWKS FC U-13 UPDATE

Since publication of the last issue the team has picked up a draw and a first away win of the season to lift them away from the bottom of the table.

The coaches have been heartened, not only by some good honest performances but also by the way the 14 squad members turn out each week for some well-structured training sessions. Few can doubt the commitment of the lads, parents, or Graham and Alan.

For me personally besides from the upturn in results, a number of events are worthy of mention.

Firstly, the spirit and togetherness the boys show as a team is great to see.

A couple of weeks ago they played their first friendly at 11 vs 11 on a full size pitch with full size goals away against Clare (who play on that pitch and in that format each week). The result was not very memorable for us, but the way the game was played and the manner in which the boys conducted themselves was superb.

I will never forget the way that players from both teams put their arms around each other as the final whistle blew and left the pitch laughing together. Many of them are school friends and there was an ex-player also. Surely that is what it is all about? No nastiness or animosity.

On 10th November I was referee and witnessed an immaculately observed minute's silence in remembrance of the young men that sacrificed all 100 years before. We reflected that some of those men wouldn't have been much older than some of the boys in the team and would have been perhaps playing for local teams before joining up.

The club has also donated a week's subs (£42) to the East Anglian Air Ambulance as one of the coaches took part in a sponsored overnight run/jog/crawl around Norwich. Anyone who knows Graham will know that it must have been a cause close to his heart as a few years ago wild horses wouldn't drag him to Norwich!

More recently the two coaches came un-stuck by pledging £5 a goal (£20 each) for the Children In Need appeal before a 4-1 victory. Match subscriptions (£39) and a sponsor donation from GRM Electrical Services (£21) meant that £100 was donated and it was agreed that £50 would go to Children In Need and the other £50 to Val and Tony Addison for their MacMillan fund.

So all is well both on and off the pitch at present. As we wait to see what winter brings us by way of fixture disruption can I just say a thank you to the senior team for allowing us to use their pitch and facilities and also to the Hundon Sports Association for making such a superb facility as the astro pitch available to us so that training can continue through the dark nights.

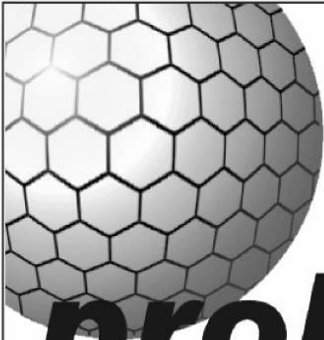

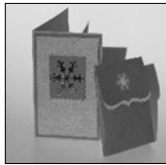

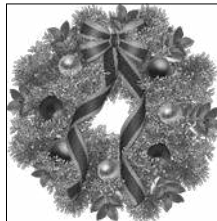
HUNDON VILLAGE SHOP NEWS

HUNDON VILLAGE HALL & PLAYING FIELD CHARITY

The Hundon Village Hall & Playing Field Charity (HVH&PFC) is a registered Charity. Its charitable object/purpose is: "To provide or assist in the provision of facilities for the inhabitants of the Parish of Hundon for recreation or other leisure-time occupation in the interests of social welfare with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants."

During recent years, the Trustees have, to the best of their ability, tried to ensure that the land and buildings owned by the HVH&PFC are used so as to not only provide facilities for the people living in the Parish of Hundon and elsewhere, but also to provide funds for its charitable purpose. It follows that looking after and maintaining these buildings and land is of prime importance; without them the Charity has nothing.

Over time, and with careful stewardship, the HVH&PFC has built up sufficient reserves to be able to do more towards its charitable purpose

For the year starting 1st January, 2019, the HVH&PFC intends giving up to a total of £5,000, spread over any person(s) or group(s) within the Parish of Hundon who successfully applies for a grant to fund a project which, in the opinion of the Trustees, meets its charitable purpose. The decision whether or not to fund any particular project will be entirely at the discretion of the Trustees, and any such decision will be final. If the Trustees decide to award a grant to your project, they may make the offer subject to any conditions they think appropriate.

Normally any grant will be given in the form of a pledge which will be valid for an agreed period of time. Actual payment would be made against a valid relevant invoice directly related to the project in question.

You may make an application for a grant to the Chairman of the Trustees, Richard Langridge, Berrynarbor House, Mill Road, Hundon, CO10 8EG. Email address: <rlangridge@hotmail.com>. Please give your name and address, briefly describe the project and explain how it will fall within HVH&PFC's charitable purpose, give the estimated total cost, set out other sources of funds being investigated and how much money is being asked for. The Trustees may ask more questions.

The Trustees hope to continue this funding in future years, but whether or not they will do so and the amount that they decide to make available will depend on the finances of the HVH&PFC.

HUNDON VILLAGE SHOP ASSOCIATION – MEMBERSHIP

As a charity, the Hundon Village Shop Association is required to maintain an up to date register of members. Since the shop was founded the make-up of the village has changed. Some of our original members have moved away and many new people have moved in – our village has expanded. In the light of these changes the Village Shop Association Committee has decided to amend the terms of membership to reflect these new circumstances. It has been agreed that **all volunteers in the shop will automatically be members of the Association** along with **any resident of Hundon who would like to be included**. There is no fee attached to membership and you are not required or expected to undertake any duties! Membership does give you the right to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting, however, and is a chance to get involved and have your say if you so wish.

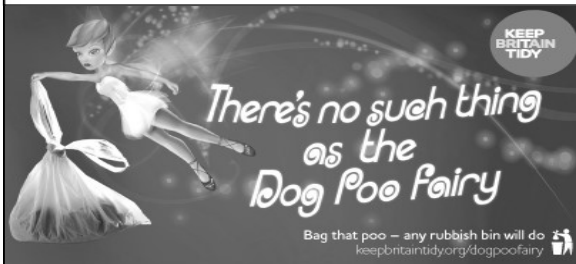

Members of the public are being urged to increase their vigilance around home and vehicle security this autumn. This reminder comes following a number of break-ins reported in the west and south of the county over the last month.

Dark evenings can provide the perfect cover for burglars but by carrying out a few simple crime prevention steps, householders and motorists can thwart opportunist criminals.

The force recently launched a new crime prevention initiative, known as 1st Principle, which highlights that simple, inexpensive measures can easily be undertaken by anyone in the community. As part of the initiative, an online suite of bespoke, easy to follow crime prevention documents are available to view and download on the constabulary's website for free. Anyone with information about thieves operating in their area should contact Suffolk police on 101 or Crimestoppers, anonymously, on 0800 555 111.

LOCK

- Lock all doors and remove the keys before leaving the house.
- Keep front doors locked even when you are at home and especially if you are in the back garden.
- Close all windows fully before you leave the house, lock downstairs windows and remove the keys.
- Use window limiters to allow air in instead of keeping windows fully open, even when you're at home.
- Install window locks on upstairs windows that can be easily accessed by a flat roof.
- Lock back gates using a sturdy lock such as a closed shackle padlock to no less than CEN 3-4 security grade or 5 lever lock.

LIGHT

- Make your home look lived in – use timer switches if you're not home.
- 'Dusk-to-dawn' sensor security lighting is a cheap, low cost way of making sure the front of your home or shed/outbuilding is well-lit.
- Visible burglar alarms can make burglars think twice; get specialist advice and consult your insurance company.
- You could also consider installing a doorbell camera in order to potentially film an opportunist burglar in action.
- Hedging and shrubs to the front of your property should be pruned to no higher than 1m and trim trees up from the ground to 2m. This will allow a clear line of sight across your property and will stop the garden being used as a hiding place.

HIDE

- Keep your valuables, jewellery, cash, passport and deeds to your property in a safe.
- Never leave spare keys in an open place. Be aware, burglars know all the usual hiding places so never leave a spare key under the doormat or under a garden gnome.
- Keep dustbins and wheelie-bins away from fencing/gates as these can be used by thieves to climb into windows or used to escape.
- Make sure valuables are property marked. Take photographs and keep a note of any serial numbers.
- Don't leave equipment and tools lying around that can be used by burglars to break into your home, such as hammers, shovels or gardening tools. Keep ladders locked away and out of sight.

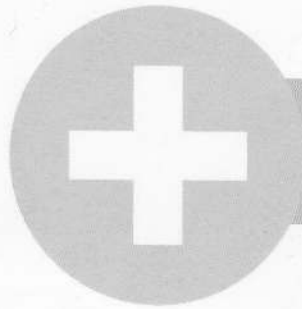
