

FROM THE REVD CANON STUART MITCHELL IN THE VICARAGE IN CLARE.

Have you heard the expression 'living in the real world?' What is it and where can we find it? I'm tempted (as Lent approaches) to say it's about a place where personal interest comes before the interest of others. Perhaps those who use the phrase 'real world' could use an alternative of 'in this day and age?' These interchangeable terms tell us that if we don't agree with the speaker then we don't know what we are talking about; a people who are left behind with the dinosaurs.

There is of course always another alternative and one in which the Christian sees the world where people try to love God and their neighbour. It's a world where a fall (from grace) is followed by repentance; where an argument is followed by an apology. A world where looking after number one is not the only priority. And a world where people get a fair and living wage, for an honest day's work and pay taxes.

The two worlds frequently collide and so how does the Christian live in the so called 'real world' with integrity. Lent is the familiar training ground for fall and repentance. Temptation is the key stone or the lynch-pin and our ability to withstand it the challenge we face. Bad habits or as some may still call them sins are only and can only be driven out by God's grace and by repeated good habits.

The good habits can be really simple, like getting out of bed when the alarm goes off. Like ignoring the buzzing phone telling of another pointless message on social media. But then it could go a bit deeper; praying together as a family or befriending someone new to the village or church. Tradition might suggest giving up something that has become very regular but unnecessary in daily life and then making a contribution to a charity. Having only one drink (caffeine related or alcohol) instead of two. And my personal fall, half the number of biscuits with a hot drink in the evening. This is all about strengthening your will. If it was easy everyone would do it.

And with the newly found strength, use it to re-inforce your faithfulness to God. Re-acquaint yourself with him. Yes he knows who you are, but truly do you know him? Being faith-full is relational; it's about growing in a deeper relationship with the one who loves us; as you might with a spouse or partner so you grow deeper in your relationship with God. Through prayer all things are possible; no need to talk endlessly to God. As the psalmist says 'be still and know that I am God'. Be still, in silence, and for once let God do the work.

This is the world in which we should strive to live in. Invite those who seek the 'real world' to this new and virtuous world where God's love abounds and fulfils all our dreams and aspirations.

SPUD IN A BUCKET COMPETITIONS

HGC (Hundon Gardening Club) is to run two competitions in 2019, open for members and non-members

The first is for U16's. Entry is free, except there is a £1 deposit payable on the bucket provided by **HGC**. **HGC** will provide a growing kit comprising bucket, compost, seed potato, and growing tips. Entry needs to be endorsed by the parent or other responsible adult. There are prizes for heaviest harvest and heaviest individual spud.

The second is for any adult. Entry fee is $\pounds 1$, and there is a $\pounds 1$ deposit payable on the bucket provided by **HGC**. **HGC** will provide a seed potato, but no compost. The prize for the heaviest harvest is a National Garden Gift Voucher.

Rules for all entrants are that no bucket or seed potato may be used other than those provided by **HGC**.

Seed potatoes and buckets will be available at the Community Café on both 4 April and 11 April (2.30 - 4.30), and at the **HGC** talk on 21 March at 7.30 in the Village Hall, or from John Christophers 01440 786274.

The harvest, weigh-in, and prize giving will take place on Sunday 21 July on the HGC allotment. This will also be a bring-your-own picnic event. The £1 deposit will be refunded when the bucket is returned after the harvest.

LITTER PICK

This is something that we do annually to tidy up our lovely village.

We're going to start at ten o'clock on Sunday (weather permitting i.e. if it's lashing down with rain stay in bed).

Never let it be said that our village wine club sits back on its laurels. Not content with a splendid first meeting of the year at the end of January our committee met shortly afterwards over some excellent vintage claret to plot some attractive expeditions and presentations.

At the January meeting, Roger Merry gave a terrific presentation of regional Portuguese wines which are pretty hard to find in the local wine shops (sadly our very own community shop doesn't have any Portuguese wine either). Most of us really liked the first white, from the Douro region, a nice, crisp number at only £8.95 from the Wine Society. The stars of the show were the two ports at the end – interestingly the most votes went to a 10 year old tawny priced at £16.50 rather than the spectacularly good 1990 vintage ruby port priced for us at £40 per bottle rather than a retail price of £90! Some good value wines bought from the Hundon shop helped the group finish off the evening with some cheese and pate.

The committee have since been busy sorting out the plans – agreed at our meeting – for setting up a proper membership list and firming up plans for meetings and activities (I mean, even raising a glass is an activity, isn't it?). The next club meeting is on Thursday 28 February when Charles Hardcastle from Joseph Barnes wines will present tempting wines from southern France. This will be his first time with us and Chris hopes for a good turnout. The committee will be asking for views on several interesting ideas for visits, usually involving good eating and drinking, and will confirm the arrangements for the June meeting which is to be a visit to Dedham Vale vineyard on 27 June for a tasting and supper.



HUNDON VILLAGE SHOP NEWS



Holmes was languishing in his rooms. He had had no new cases to work on in some weeks and even Inspector Lestrade was a stranger these days. He was desperate to hear the tread upon the stair that would promise the game was afoot. His long suffering friend, Watson, was trying to cheer him up when Mrs. Hudson appeared with news of a visitor. The man shuffled into the room, his hat in his hand and a doubtful expression on his face.

"Come, my good fellow, what can we do for you?" asked Holmes.

The visitor looked downhearted but replied timidly, "I fear you will think my case trivial, sir. Nonetheless, it is of sufficient import to have concerned our little community. There are two questions that I'm frequently asked about Nordic Walking. The first is who is Nordic Walking aimed at? The simple answer to the first part of the question is that "If you can walk, you can Nordic Walk" and therefore it is likely to be for you. At Nordic Walking East Anglia, we have taught people who fall into the following categories:

- aged 8 to 88
- men and women
- the superfit wanting a new form of cross training
- the unfit wanting a gentle and fun way of returning to exercise
- the overweight wanting to lose weight
- people wanting to improve their posture
- new arrivals to the area wanting to meet others
- pre/post op hip/knee replacements wanting to strengthen muscle tone
- walking enthusiasts who enjoy outdoor exercise
- arthritis sufferers who want to improve flexibility and mobility
- dog walkers wanting to turn their walk into a workout
- Parkinson's sufferers wanting to slow the rate of neuropathy

This list is not exhaustive, there are many other reasons for people joining our classes, however, it does demonstrate the inclusive nature of this fabulous form of fitness. If you fall into one of the categories above then come and give it a go.

The second question that crops up regularly is, how is a class structured? Our classes last an hour and we teach the internationally recognised Nordic Walking technique, which ensures that you gain the full benefits of walking with poles, such as improved posture, reduced impact on joints and improved muscle tone. Once the basic technique has been learnt, we continue to consolidate learning by incorporating fun technique exercises into the class, which also serve as icebreakers. We cover a couple of miles during the course of the hour, and walking is broken up by exercises that aim to improve balance and muscle strength. In order to improve general cardio-vascular fitness we incorporate a couple of sets of HIIT (high intensity interval training) exercises, which last for about 30 seconds each. During the walking sections, talking is encouraged! Nordic Walking is a great way to exercise while meeting new people and, due to demand, we ensure that our walks finish near a good cafe.


