Estate Charity Thomas Rogeron/Relief in Need Charity 2018 Report

<u>Trustees:</u> Messrs. Davis, Impey and Turner (chair); Rev Mitchell; Mesdames Morse and Turner; Miss Upson (clerk).

<u>Farmland</u>: All Rogeron farmland is being rented with income continuing to be stable. That being rented to a local business has been cleared and fenced, resulting in improved access and tidiness.

Allotments:

There are approximately 37 'paid' allotments, of a variety of sizes, with many being garden extensions. Rules and guidelines for the allotment holders have been finalised and allotment holders are now asked to sign up to these as a condition of keeping an allotment. Trees and hedges have been tidied up or removed, depending on their condition. The many rubbish heaps have been cleared; from the beginning of 2018 allotment holders are responsible for disposing of any waste from "their" allotments. Mr. Basham has done a sterling job of keeping the grass tidy and the footpaths close mown. The bank at the southern end of the field has been left, for the most part, to encourage wildlife. Water was laid on from February. To help ensure the cost of routine maintenance is covered, the rent was raised from the current £5 a basic plot in 2018. This will remain for 2019 but will be raised again in 2020 to a more realistic rate. The Trustees are extremely grateful to Mr. Davis for the terrific work he has done on the allotment area (and his goodwill) and to Mr. Smith (the Trust's Land Agent) for his excellent advice, support and patience.

USE IT OR LOSE IT!

One of the main reasons given for the poor uptake for allotments has been the lack of water supply. Despite the provision of a mains water standpipe and other improvements making the allotments more attractive, the overall increase in the number of allotments is, sadly, only 2. The allotment income does not reflect the recent capital expenditure on improvements, let alone the annual running costs. This situation cannot be allowed to continue and, unless there is a noticeable increase in demand for allotments, other alternative uses will have to be considered.

<u>Hundon Educational Fund:</u> The Fund received a grant of £3,750 from Rogerons.

PCC: The PCC received a grant of £2,500 from the Rogeron Charity. Maintenance of the church clock continues to be paid for (as part of the Charity's statute).

<u>Other grants from the "main" trust:</u> 2 local organisations received grants to help ensure their viability, so that members are able to enjoy improved access to leisure and social facilities.

RIN: The Relief in Need Charity (Hundon Trust Fund) received £1,250, also from the Trust. Grants of approximately £1,500 were distributed. These included funding to help members of local organisations enjoy improved access to leisure and social facilities and also grants to help parishioners within their homes, with their disability needs and to gain qualifications.

FROM THE REVD CANON STUART MITCHELL AT THE VICARAGE IN CLARE

Dear Friends.

In these weeks following Easter, they are for me, a time of renewing my relationship with a group of people who collectively are known as the Apostles. A time to reflect on what it means to have faith. The story of Thomas is key to this. He wasn't present when Jesus appeared to the Apostles as they gathered in fear in a closed room. He was the next time and his profound declaration that to him, Thomas, Jesus was 'My Lord and my God' comes as a statement of faith. Believing in something you haven't seen or heard first hand but get the story from someone else is the essence of having a faith. Much of what we do in this very modern age is risky; but having faith that others have done it before means we accept the risk; putting our faith to the test.

Religious faith is a very special gift or power from God that allows the believer to make the jump from the see, touch and feel world we inhabit into the world of the spirit, the mystery. Without the gift of faith, accepting Jesus was risen from the dead is a bit difficult to believe. Thomas had evidence and he still doubted. Jesus then says to him 'Blessed are those who did not see and yet believed'. And I guess that's all of us. Faith is our personal response to God, who showed himself through Jesus. And the gift that makes that all work is grace. BY grace the faith of a Christian is strengthened by prayer and spiritual reading. It's also good to talk to others about your prayers, what you have read from the Bible and even for 'professionals' we don't do this often or well enough. Hence this message for May. Faith like a muscle grows when it is exercised; if we fail to exercise properly it grows week and eventually dies. In the worst of cases we can lose our faith; through faith we get direction to our lives. So in the days following Easter I read with greater enthusiasm in the Acts of Apostles of Peter, James, Stephen, Saul (later Paul) and the many women and men who were called and baptised into the Christian faith always eager to meet with and make new converts.

The call by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York and echoed in this Diocese to pray 'Thy Kingdom Come' over the last few years has really caught on. It begins on Ascension Day, May 30th and continues to Pentecost, Sunday 9th June. It's not about large groups, or even groups gathering at all but obviously that can be helpful, but simply making an extra conscience effort to pray, as individuals; Our Father who art in Heaven, Hallowed be thy name, Thy Kingdom come...

H G C Community Project for 2019

Hundon Gardening Club's major community project for this year is beginning to take form.



We are planning to plant up the grass area in front of the Village Hall with native bulbs. So far, the Village Hall and Playing Fields Charity committee have given us permission. Marcus has measured up and drawn a plan of the area. Discussions between Mike Chinery, consultant, Jayne Tabram and Janet Burrows from HGC have taken place and possible bulbs and trees to plant have been talked over.

The next phase is to design the planting schemes, and estimate how many of each of the bulbs we will need and discuss possible trees with specialised tree nursery. When costs have been ascertained we will be looking for funding. If you would like to contribute to this project we would be very grateful to hear from you. As the object of the project is to plant only native bulbs we will not be asking for donations of bulbs but money so we can purchase native bulbs from specialist suppliers.

March

Following the talk by Dr Richard Jennaway a cheque for £27 was sent to the Woodland Trust.

April
17 of us set off for Devil's Dyke at Newmarket on Friday 12 April - The 17 included two children plus 3 dogs, who all behaved themselves! On one side of the Dyke we could see parts of Newmarket race course and the golf course the other side open countryside and there mainly down the bank, we spotted many patches of Pasque flowers. Pity the picture here is in black and white, this was taken on our walk. Thank you very much Muriel for leading this walk in the countryside to see this seldom seen wild flower. Only found naturally growing wild on a small



number of sites throughout the UK, the Pasque flower requires guite a specific habitat, mainly well drained limestone or chalk (calcareous) grassland, with help from sheep grazing during the winter months. Our day was completed by having tea and refreshments at Wavertrees Coffee Shop at the Newmarket Stud (open to all).



Saturday 20 - A visit on one of two Open days held at Fox Fritillary Meadow to see Snakes Head Fritillary. Nine of us set off on a glorious afternoon, to see one of the few remaining meadows where the fritillary flowers. The meadow was left to the Suffolk Wildlife Trust by the previous owner. The field is cut down when the time is right then sheep graze on the open meadows. The sight of the meadow full of flowers in bloom was the best in the last 10 years according to one of the Wildlife Trust's team. We were allowed to walk through the meadow admiring and photographing the wild flowers. We finally and reluctantly left the meadow and headed for Stonham Barns for a well deserved cup of tea and cake.





BROXTED SOLAR COMMUNITY FUND FOR HUNDON

This was established following the completion of the solar farm in 2014. To date the Fund has awarded a total of £45,500, benefitting the Primary School, Pre-School and various clubs and organisations. We invite applications for this year and will welcome any that can be shown to bring material benefit to make our village an even better place in which to live and enjoy!

APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING - 2019

The main features of the Community Fund are summarised: -

- This year the total amount awarded will be £10,500. This will include a direct annual payment of £1,500 to Hundon School.
- The balance of £9,000 will be awarded to organisations or groups within Hundon. To receive an award from the Community Fund, an application must make a material change or create material benefit for the Community in and around Hundon, and may include revenue items as well as capital payments.
- The minimum award through the Community Fund will be £1,000 as any applicant must demonstrate 'material change' or 'material benefit' for the Community i.e. not narrowly focused or small in size or scope.
- The Community Fund is run by the Community Fund Group who will meet to discuss the merits of each application to determine whether or not they qualify for funding and if so how much will be awarded. At any one time the Group will consist of four members:
 - The Chairman or Representative of the Parish Council currently Geoff Spooner
 - The Chairman or Representative of the Village Hall Committee.
 - One other representative of the Hundon Community with wide knowledge and experience of it currently David Rowlinson who was Parish Council Chairman when the proposal for Broxted Solar was presented at a meeting which was also attended by Dorothy Whittaker who was Hundon's Borough Councillor at the time.
 - A representative of Navigator Land LLP, the owners of Broxted Estate (and hence landlords of Broxted Solar) - the first such representative being Charles Ryder. David Rowlinson acts as Chairman of the Community Fund Group and Charles Ryder/ Navigator Land LLP administers it.

If your club or Organisation has a project requiring funding and which meets the above criteria, submit details of what any award will be used for and where it involves the purchase of equipment or services should include more than one quote. Please note that all applications must be for projects which require £1,000 or more and which will be completed within 1 year of receipt of the award.

Applications should be emailed to Charles Ryder at charles@gbfco.com by 30th June.

During the ensuing two weeks, the Community Fund Group will consider the applications seeking, where necessary, further information. The Group will then make recommendations to Broxted Solar as to which applications should be awarded funding and payments are anticipated to be made by the end of August. Depending on the total sum requested from all applications, some which qualify may not receive an award this year, but such projects can apply again next year.

The Community Fund Group looks forward to receiving applications in the coming weeks. We very much hope that Broxted Solar's Community Fund will continue to be of great benefit to the Community of Hundon over the coming years.



FROM POLICE CONNECT WARNING TO DRONE USERS – NESTING SITES

Police in Suffolk are urging people who fly drones, either commercially or as hobbyists, to be mindful of the locations they operate in at this time of year due to nesting birds.

The county has some very sensitive sites in Suffolk where rare bird breeds, both native and non-native, are either already nesting or will shortly be arriving to do so. Some of these sites are protected from entry, so some users of drone may want to try and get a view from above, using the technology that is available.

People who fly drones are reminded that it is an offence to intentionally or recklessly disturb any wild bird listed on Schedule 1 whilst it is nest building or is in, on or near a nest with eggs or young; or to disturb the dependant young of such a bird.

Sgt Brian Calver from the Rural Crime team said: "From a bird's perspective, a drone is likely to be seen as a predator and as such cause distress and disturbance, which amounts to an offence, if nesting. Just causing the bird to momentarily leave the nest is sufficient to commit the offence. We do not want to spoil everyone's enjoyment of the countryside, but we would urge users of drones to be sensible and think twice about where they are flying."

Fabian Harrison, from RSPB Suffolk, said: "Drones can have severe consequences for breeding birds, leading to abandonment and an increased risk of detection by predators. At a time when wildlife already faces so many challenges, we are imploring the public to stay vigilant this summer and keep an eye out for wildlife crime. Remember – if you see a crime in progress, always call 999."

Police would also take the opportunity to remind people that the legislation is also relevant to dog owners around ground nesting birds, so equally we would urge people to be considerate and think about where they let their dogs off the lead.

If officers get evidence of such offences being committed, police will take action, which could potentially result in six months' imprisonment or a fine of up to $\pounds 5,000$
