HUNDON PARISH COUNCIL

The Councillors of your new Hundon Parish Council are:

Due to some apparent confusion within the previous Parish Council about the election process, only three of the previous Councillors, plus three aspirant Councillors, making a total of six people, put in their nomination papers for the seven available places on the Parish Council. This meant that on May 2nd the Returning Officer for West Suffolk declared the Election of Parish Councillors for Hundon as Uncontested. We later received two applications to fill the seventh seat on the Council and we are delighted that Jean Thomas has agreed to join us.

At the Annual Parish Meeting, prior to the new Councillors taking office, the Chairman, Parish Clerk and several other Councillors unexpectedly resigned and left the Meeting. The subsequent handover to the new Parish Council is proving somewhat problematic, and, due to a number of unforeseen circumstances, is taking longer than anticipated.

Please be patient with us. We are doing our best to get matters sorted and to then serve the Community as you would want and expect.

Meanwhile, if you have any concerns which you think concerns the Parish Council, please do not hesitate to approach any of the above Councillors. We may not have an immediate answer but you will be listened to with courtesy and respect and an answer given as soon as is possible.



BROXTED SOLAR COMMUNITY FUND FOR HUNDON

Visit by executives from "Cubico", the owners of Broxted Solar on Thursday, July 18th 2019

It is 5 years since the Broxted Solar Community Fund (the Fund) was established and many organisations in Hundon have subsequently received substantial Awards (a minimum of £1,000) which has enabled them to provide benefits for the Community. Charles Ryder of Navigator Land whose family own the land, was able in 2011/2012 to repurchase the airfield (over 500 acres) which had been requisitioned for Stradishall airfield before the Second World War. Charles was convinced that renewable energy was the way forward and so Broxted Solar was constructed on 150 acres of land making it one of the largest in the UK. However unlike many such schemes because it is sited on a plateau it is barely visible; only if you look in a North-Easterly direction after turning right towards the village at Hundon Hall can you see a few of the panels. The Fund was initiated by Charles Ryder of Navigator Land together with Cubico who own Broxted Solar as a gesture of appreciation for the help received in supporting the scheme. Cubico, a world-wide company operating many similar renewable energy schemes, finance the Fund which will continue to provide benefits over the initial 25 year life of the Solar Farm..

The visit was arranged to enable Steve Packwood and Valerio Scupola, senior executives of "Cubico" to see how the money granted benefitted the Community. They were particularly keen to go to the Primary School which automatically receives an annual Award of £1,500, as well as having the opportunity to apply for funding for particular needs. Headteacher Sharon Fitzgerald provided a most comprehensive and informative tour of the School and explained how the award given this year would go towards an outdoor "classroom" where specially trained staff can provide emotional support in an age where the young face increasing pressures not least through social media. In visiting classrooms it was apparent that pupils were highly motivated and working enthusiastically!

Afterwards the party went to the Shop and Post Office and where they learnt how much these important services rely on the many volunteers who give their time to make sure that such vital lifelines are not lost as happens in so many Communities. Next a brief visit to the Village Hall where they were impressed to learn of the plans for a cinema-quality projection system before a flying visit to the Cricket Pavilion where Nick Clarke explained how Awards made had resulted in the facility being used by other groups in the village including the School. Then it was up to "The Plough" where representatives of the various organisations who had received awards over the years had gathered. Steve and Valerio enjoyed a pleasant half-hour chatting and hearing about how the Awards which, amongst other things, had helped to pay for much-needed repairs to the Church organ and renovating /adding missing names to the War Memorial before relocating it to a more prominent position in the village. David Rowlinson then thanked them both for taking the time to come to Hundon and see for themselves what a difference Cubico's generosity had made and how he hoped that they had found it interesting. Steve replied by saying how much they had enjoyed coming to the village and meeting such friendly people, saying that he found it quite humbling and thanked everyone for making them feel so welcome.

<u>July 2019</u> <u>Sunday 7</u> – Garden visit to 'Two Cottages' at Chrishall. *One* for the rose lovers. 17 of us set off on a glorious Sunday afternoon and the glory carried on and on. A garden visit recommended by a member certainly impressed us all. Beautiful roses, shrubs, perennials everywhere. I think most of us could sit in the many seating areas all day but not fancy the work it must take to keep it up.

Sunday 14 - Following a talk on Neil Dickinson's life-long love of butterflies we joined a Butterfly walk at Bradfield Woods organised by the Suffolk Wildlife Trust. The walk was led by Fay Jones. 10 of us managed to get booked on the walk. We set out

on a not too sunny afternoon and the prospect of finding any

butterflies wasn't looking good. As the afternoon progressed the sun came out and in the glades that Fay led us to revealed their insects and plenty of butterflies. We found the sweetest little orange Large Skippers, a Comma, looking like a tatty tortoiseshell, orange and brown, with a white 'comma' on its underwing, Silver Washed Fritillary, (pictured), Ringlets, Meadow Browns, Green Veined White, a White Admiral and a very battered Purple Hairstreak. It was a very respectable butterfly count for an afternoon that started very dull. We ended the very interesting afternoon with a well earned cup of tea and piece of cake at Bradfield Woods Centre.



Thursday 18 - David Smale - What a lovely evening listening to David in his quest to grow and market a very genuine product. In the Middle Ages, England was the world's biggest saffron producer, but as things happen it started to be grown more cheaply in other parts of the world, India and Iran to name two. David, a geophysicist by training, and soil his speciality, started on a very small scale, his patio! After many trials and tribulations he is winning. POLICE CONNECT

With Suffolk enjoying some warm summer weather, police are reminding people to consider their home and vehicle security to deter thieves.

Many burglaries take place due to a lack of security with insecure windows and doors being deemed as two of the main ways in which opportunist thieves gained access to homes and vehicles.

Detective Superintendent Marina Ericson said: "It will come as no surprise that the summer months are always popular for thieves and with warmer weather on the way, it is likely many of us will spend more time outdoors. Therefore, it's important that we all continue to take security seriously and lock up – even if you're in another area of the house or in the garden.

"Thieves are opportunist and operate quickly. Typically, they will look for the easy option by looking for gaps in security and are often not afraid to try door locks. If they see an easy way to enter a property and steal something valuable, sadly, they'll take it so I would urge people not to leave valuable items such as laptops, vehicle keys and jewellery in view of windows.

"It's important to point out that our solved rate for residential burglary has seen an increase of 2.4% over the past 12 months, demonstrating that burglary remains a priority for the force and we continue to work hard to detect these crimes. Our burglary strategy includes the close monitoring and scrutinising of offences to help us understand crime trends, the methodologies employed by criminals and targeting 'hotspot' areas to ensure deployment of our resources effectively.

"Remember to keep garages and outbuildings secure too as burglars often look for times to help them break into homes. Be neighbourly by looking out for your local community and always report any suspicious activity to police. If you believe a burglary to be in progress always dial 999."

Suffolk Police and Crime Commissioner Tim Passmore said: "With the fine weather that's forecast for the coming weeks, it is only natural that we all want to open windows and doors to enjoy the sunshine, but I would ask everyone to be aware of their home security so we don't give burglars the opportunity to pounce.

"Suffolk is a safe place to live and we want to keep it that way. If we could all take a little time to read the constabulary's simple tips and check our homes and garages are secure, we will hopefully reduce the number of these opportunist burglaries and have a summer to remember for the right reasons."

Suffolk police offers the following advice to residents:

LOCK

- Lock all doors and remove the keys before leaving the house
- Keep front doors locked even when you are at home and especially if you are in the back garden.
- Close all windows fully before you leave the house, lock downstairs windows and remove the keys.

- Use window limiters to allow air in instead of keeping windows fully open, even when you're at home.
- Install window locks on upstairs windows that can be easily accessed by a flat roof.
- Lock back gates using a sturdy lock such as a closed shackle padlock to no less than CEN 3-4 security grade or 5 lever lock.

LIGHT

- Make your home look lived in use timer switches if you're not home.
- 'Dusk-to-dawn' sensored security lighting is a cheap, low cost way of making sure the front of your home or shed/ outbuilding is well-lit.
- Visible burglar alarms can make burglars think twice; get specialist advice and consult your insurance company.
- •You could also consider installing a Ring doorbell camera in order to potentially film an opportunist burglar in action.

• Hedging and shrubs to the front of your property should be pruned to no higher than 1m and trim trees up from the ground to 2m. This will allow a clear line of sight across your property and will stop the garden being used as a hiding place.

HIDE

- Keep your valuables, jewellery, cash, passport and deeds to your property in a safe.
- Never leave spare keys in an open place. Be aware, burglars know all the usual hiding places so never leave a spare key under the doormat or under a garden gnome.
- Keep dustbins and wheelie-bins away from fencing/gates as these can be used by thieves to climb into windows or used to escape.
- Make sure valuables are property marked. Take photographs and keep a note of any serial numbers.
- Don't leave equipment and tools lying around that can be used by burglars to break into your home, such as hammers, shovels or gardening tools. Keep ladders locked away and out of sight.

FAIR TO BOOST SKILLS AND REDUCE SOCIAL ISOLATION

Residents young and old from across West Suffolk are invited to two events being held next month designed to boost skills and reduce social isolation.

The West Suffolk Skills Share Fair is free to attend and is open to anyone who would you like to learn new skills or improve existing skills, or who is looking to return to work, perhaps following time out looking after children or a period of unemployment. The Fair is also targeted at anyone who is willing to support the local economy through volunteering as well as people who are recently retired, but willing to support younger people in learning about the world of work.

The drop in events which take place across two mornings has been organised by the team of nine interns working at West Suffolk Council. Cllr Susan Glossop, Cabinet Member for Growth at the Council said: "We work with a variety of education, employment and other partners and we want to inspire people to improve existing skills and learn new ones. This in turn may help giving people the confidence to undertake voluntary work in their community, start-up their own business venture or to gain new employment and in so doing contribute to the success of our local economy.

What is a friend?

Recently I was reflecting on what it means to have a good friend, or - if we are fortunate enough - even several good friends in our lives. The thought arose when I was sitting in Liverpool Street station recently, waiting for my train and surrounded by hundreds of strangers. I found this disconcerting. I have become used to popping out in Sudbury, or into one of our parishes, or even Bury - and always bumping into someone I know and passing the time of day. It may not be an actual friend, just a familiar face, but at least it's someone to stop and say hello to and comment on the weather, however good or bad, in our inimitable British way. I had a long wait at the station, and would have appreciated an opportunity to talk to a friendly face, but everyone was scurrying about in their own world - strangers to each other and seemingly totally unaware of anyone around them. What an irony - I felt dismally alone despite being surrounded by so many! And yet each of those people was someone's friend - they just weren't mine!

But there are friends and friends. We can amass hundreds of 'friends' on social media sites – many we probably don't know at all well. We can be a 'friend' to an organisation that we want to support, particularly financially; or we can be 'friendly' towards people, perhaps neighbours or those we meet on an occasional basis, such as when we visit our local shop.

And so this led me to wonder about friends, and what makes a good friend. Is it someone we've known many years, or more recently? Is it someone we can call any time, night or day, and ask for help - or someone whose company we just enjoy for a day or evening out? If we are lucky, it's someone who will be with us on happy occasions, but also during those dark, bleak times in our lives when we find it hard to cope - someone who can lend us a solid shoulder on which to cry. Actually, I think it's all of those and more. Ralph Waldo Emerson once said: "The only way to have a friend is to be one" - and that's a profound statement, because friendship cuts both ways. If we want and appreciate all the qualities a friend provides, then naturally we reciprocate, and feel honoured to do so.

In the Bible, the Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes is full of advice, and one line I am particularly drawn to is from Chapter 4: "By yourself you're unprotected. With a friend you can face the worst." How true - especially when times are difficult. Being there for someone you know, love and respect, when they need you most - whether it's helping in a practical way or just listening to them - is something we can all do. It costs nothing, and yet it is worth a fortune.

Human friends are important, and so is Christ, who is friend to all and who looks upon us as His friends too. Christ is with us in good times and bad, in times of joy and laughter, sadness and grief; when we are lonely and no human friend is around for us. All we need to do is call upon Him and He is there, ready to offer an outstretched hand or solid shoulders on which to carry our burden.

Maybe at Liverpool Street station I should have reminded myself of this verse from the book of Revelation, and then I wouldn't have felt so alone: "Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me."


Indeed, for over an hour, our little country church was filled with glorious sounds, songs and music.

HUNDON WINE CLUB NEWS

On a perfect June evening the Wine Club went on tour. We were fortunate enough to arrange a visit to Dedham Vale Vineyard in Boxted. 15 of us boarded our bus at the village hall and were joined by others that had made their own way to the vineyard where, following drinks, we were placed in the hands of our guide Hugo.

Hugo is the son of the estate owners and is the business manager. He explained the development plans of the winery and led us to the grapevines. We were told that 10 varieties of vine are planted, and gave us an explanation of the growing year of the vine, from autumn pruning to bud, flower and fruit set, general management of the vines and eventually to the so important harvest. Along with some assistance from their resident Spanish winemaker Chus Bartolomeo, we were informed of the pests and diseases of the vines that must be combated, and the "double guyot" method of training they employ to maximise the yield of each vine.

From the growing area we were then led by Chus to the winery itself. At the time of our visit this area was undergoing a drastic renovation and was not functioning. However, all the machinery was in place from the destalker, grape press, fermentation vats and bottling plant. We were able to fully grasp the whole process from grape to bottle. At present their crop is sent to Chilford Winery for processing before being returned for sales at Dedham.

All this of course made us very thirsty and hungry. We were then given a tutored tasting of their wines; whites, rosé, fizz and some red too. Following this we sat down to a delightful cold buffet and dessert with some more wines in the tasting room overlooking the hydrangea fringed lake returning quite sated to Hundon by bus. A great visit and an ideal way to pass a beautiful spring evening, much enjoyed by all.

EUROPEAN U-20 LACROSSE CHAMPIONSHIPS.

England took the lead for the first time with two quick goals. Another goal saw England go ahead 9-7 in the latter stage of the match. Germany retaliated with a late goal to set up a nail biting finale. England held on to run out winners 9-8 and collect the gold medal.


