RESPONSE

As one of your former Parish Councillors I would like to respond to the notice from the new Parish Council that appeared on the front page of last month's Hundon Herald.

In so far as the election of Councillors was concerned, Sue did receive nomination papers from the County Council, but did not receive any instructions whatsoever, nor a date by which the papers needed to be submitted. As a result of this, myself, Helen Ballantyne Andrew Jeffreys and Jenna Mayes failed to submit our nomination papers.

It is for this reason that, at the Annual Parish meeting, at which there was a lot of heckling from a couple of individuals, the four of us decided collectively to stand down along with the clerk Sue Button This meant that there was no longer a quorum and so the meeting had to be terminated.


The subsequent election for the new Council included 3 new members who joined the remaining members of the old Council. To say that the handover to the newly formed Council was problematic, and taking longer than anticipated, is hard to understand as firstly, the 3 former councillors have between them many years of experience serving on the Council (one of whom has served as chairman several times). and secondly, all relevant paperwork and documentation was handed over following my resignation.

As far as I am aware, your new Council has not yet held a properly constituted meeting and so cannot be serving the community as they should.

I did subsequently apply to fill the vacant seventh seat, but was unsuccessful. I was advised of this simply by somebody calling on my home phone and asking to leave a message for me. If this is an indication of how matters will be dealt with, then I really do not hold out much hope!

FROM THE REVD CANON STUART MITCHELL AT THE VICARAGE IN CLARE

Dear Friends,

It has often been said 'Don't put off till tomorrow what you can do today'. Jesus said 'be dressed for action, have your lamps lit'. I'm inclined to go for both as a reminder that not only should we be prepared for any eventuality but we should also go for it now, immediately and not wait. But that then offers a huge contradiction when we read in Psalms to 'Wait on the Lord'. Wait-not wait.

You see if I was a person who could make decisions I wouldn't have any trouble at all; but I'm not an impulsive type of person. I must have all the information to hand before considering the next step. Over the years I have come to understand that waiting has benefits and often as not an impulsive decision brings chaos and calamity. Inevitably what that means is impulsive decisions cost me time and likely as not money. Waiting, or more descriptively, prevaricating, does bring a reward eventually. I once was impatient, but I didn't have the time to make a career out of it.

Now I prevaricate and hope something good comes along in the time I spend weighing up the pros and cons, carrying out a strength and weakness analysis. I'm the person who invested in a Sony Betamax video recorder. The quality was top notch. Sony refused to give a general licence and JVC (I think) sold the world the VHS recorder. I had both. Thankfully I never got caught up in the Video disc race. Image for those under the age of 30, a CD or DVD the size of a vinyl LP record (33cm or 12 inches in diameter). The latter back in fashion. I do believe that if something I would write on a sheet of paper were to be folded in a precise manner and slipped into the said envelope and a sticky coloured piece of paper placed in the top right hand corner and something called a postal address appended to the said envelope and it were to be placed in red cylindrical receptacle, I am led to believe someone may be able to read the contents of the letter. Now how do I do that around the readership of thirteen churches? Do you see my predicament?

It took the writing of St Paul hundreds of years and much prevarication in councils to get his work read by BILLIONS of Christians around the world. Sometimes, just sometimes, waiting on God for his glorious mysteries to be unveiled is worth every minute of the wait. And the PC question – well it will probably be Apple or perhaps not. I have had enough of PCs but do I really want to throw away years of experience and start all over again?






