Hundon Parish Council met on Wednesday 21st November 2019

Review of Internal Audit was noted and approved, with the Clerk to action recommendations.

Trees at Galley Road, West Suffolk Council have been established as owning the land and the trees are on the rota for maintenance early 2020.

Chairman Bob Barnett resigned from the Council, the Councillors thanked him for his work for the Parish Council and wished him all the best.

#### Reports by County and District Councillors

Clare community hub started operations at the library on Monday 18 November from 10am-12noon and will meet every Monday to offer advice sessions from CAB and Haverhill REACH

A meeting about drug activity locally and what parents and communities can do to protect and educate our young people could be of interest to the Parish Council – the clerk to arrange a meeting.

A new and improved recycling centre will open in Bury St Edmunds at the end of November. The flagship site in Fornham Road will replace the current recycling centre at Rougham Hill, Bury St Edmunds. The new centre will be the first open air site in Suffolk where all containers can be accessed by the public from ground level. Visitors will be able to recycle the same wide range of materials currently available at the Rougham Hill Recycling Centre. A charity Reuse shop, which will take materials suitable for reuse from our recycling centres, will also be opening on site towards the end of the year.

In the run up to Christmas we can all get carried away looking for bargains. Please be very wary of special offers especially via the internet. Suffolk Trading Standards are warning people "don't be tempted to participate" in sharing an Argos giveaway post as it "is fraudulent." A post on the Suffolk Trading Standards Facebook page said: "A post claiming that everyone who shares and takes part in an Argos giveaway post will be in a chance of winning £1000 in vouchers, is currently circulating on Facebook. This post is fraudulent and has no connection to Argos. Nobody who participates will receive the vouchers. If you see one of these giveaway posts, don't be tempted to participate. "You have no chance of winning the promised prize, and you may risk your privacy and security by sharing your personal information with online scammers."

There were four of us – George, Harris, and myself, and Montmorency...of course. We were sitting in my room and talking about how bad we were...from a medical point of view that is. We decided we were all suffering from overwork. I agreed and suggested that we should seek out some retired and old world spot far from the madding crowd. We happened upon Hundon and thought it would do us the world of good to make a recreational stay there. Harris insisted on taking charge of the preparations and George suggested we check on the weather. But who wants to be foretold the weather? It is bad enough when it comes without our having the misery of knowing about it beforehand.



#### DECEMBER LETTER FROM THE CURATE

#### Dear friends,

This Christmas I'm buying my husband a toilet. Yes, a toilet. Not for our house – we already have enough - but a toilet for a family in Africa. And my parents? Well, they will be receiving some fruit trees that will be planted in Bangladesh for a family living in extreme poverty. These trees will help towards countering the effects of climate change, as well as providing the grower with a source of healthy fruit and perhaps a chance to make some money from selling the produce. As for my sister, she will have a cookery voucher – not for her, as she's a brilliant cook, but for a family in Africa who need help to get the best from their home grown produce by understanding the principals of nutrition and cooking.

These are just some of the Christmas presents on my list, and if I drop enough hints I may be receiving the 'adoption papers' for an orang-utan in Borneo as my gift! As you can probably tell, my household have decided enough is enough. We can no longer tolerate the excessive cost - financially but much more importantly, to the planet - of purchasing presents that generally our family have no desire to receive. After all, how many more pairs of socks can we squeeze into our already heaving drawers?

Once we decided to go down this route, I felt as if a weight had been lifted. No need to spend precious time buying and wrapping something that before Christmas is over, will be put to one side and forgotten about. However, thought and consideration is still needed – perhaps more so, as we go really 'green' this Christmas. I want to choose items that will mean something to the receiver, such as a cooking gift for an African family, which fits well with my sister who appreciates good and healthy cooking.

There are plenty of charities from which to source these gifts: Christian Aid, Water Aid, Send a Cow, Traidcraft, WWF and so on. But if an actual gift is still something we want to buy, as I know I will do, then instead of buying something imported from halfway across the world, it would be so much better to purchase locally. Here in Suffolk we are blessed with a wealth of talented artists, gift makers and artisan producers – many of whom we will find at the various Christmas fairs and markets taking place at the moment. Oh, and don't forget to use recycled paper to wrap them!

Psalm 24 says this: "The earth is the LORD's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it," which means that God created this planet, we are his custodians, and we should be mindful of this. In fact, taking it one step further, if we read the Old Testament book of Genesis, God actually commanded humankind to take care of his creation.

Working towards a more sustainable way of life needs to be the norm. Christians especially should do this out of their love for God and all that he has made and gifted to us; it should be out of love for our families, friends and all whom we know, and particularly for the younger generations, both today's and those yet to come. Surely Christmas and the time of goodwill that it generates is absolutely the best and most appropriate occasion to do this!

#### HUNDON VILLAGE POPPY APPEAL -RESULTS 2019

You will have noticed in the September Herald our collectors. I repeat their names now as these are the people who will walk the streets of the village to collect money and hopefully not give you too much of a fright after dark! Richard Langridge, Simon Hickes, Phil Impey, Marion Rowlinson, Loraine Callow, Paul Rymills, Catherine Clark, Penny Smith and Sue Walker. Poppy boxes and tins are put in The Rose and Crown (£60.97), The Plough (£14), Hundon Primary School (£44.40), the Village Shop (£96.01) and Barnardiston Prep School (£100.76). I am most grateful to them all and to Phil Impey, Marion Rowlinson and Peter Loup from Clare who helped make up the counting team of four. Those collectors from our village know their own results.

I had two cries for help – one from Stoke by Clare Shop and the other Stoke College. No one had issued a poppy box and tin to Stoke College and the very supportive Kate Dadd gave up on the village having collected for five years without any help. She did however, with a little gentle persuasion that was not difficult, take one of our unused boxes and a tin in the village shop as she runs it, and raised £65.90 in Week 2 of the Appeal. Stoke College raised (£76.65) and have asked to join the Hundon group next year as has Kate in the shop. Kate hopes that she has two recruits to collect in the village next year and is hopeful of more and so once again will cover the village.

Our Hundon Village total was  $\pounds 2058.03 - a$  very good result. What has become clear this year is that more people are using Gift Aid – the system whereby a tax payer, normally someone still working, can gain an additional 25% of their donation at no extra cost to the donor – so someone donating  $\pounds 10$  will actually donate  $\pounds 12.50$  to the Appeal at no extra cost to themselves.

I must also make mention of June Mansfield the sole collector in Poslingford, and someone who would rather collect on her own. June had another successful year collecting £97.31. I am most grateful to her. So we now have, in addition to Hundon -Clare, Stoke by Clare, Poslingford and Stoke College.

May I thank you all who helped make up that donation. And there will be others who got their poppy from Tesco or somewhere downtown. My thanks to them. Looking ahead I am looking for someone to take on a pitch run by David Crawley until he left for Scotland. Whilst the pitch is in the village much of it is in unlit streets and, having consulted a few people, is probably best suited to a retired man. Look above and you will see that we have more women than men. This is not to even things up but it is probably torch work after 4.30/4.45 - best times to catch people returning from work and better done by a chap who might not be quite so frightened walking around in the dark.


