



FROM THE REVD CANON STUART MITCHELL AT THE VICARAGE IN CLARE

The frenzy of the preparation for Christmas for most is over for another year. Each year the anticipation of Christmas is always greater than the celebration and I know that kind of preparation for me will change next year. Outside the walls of the vicarage and the parish churches Christmas means different things and when it doesn't come up to expectation there is inevitable disappointment.

Present buying is so demanding; did you buy the present way back in the summer, or later, perhaps in the days leading up to Christmas Day? The reality of the day comes when the present given, is opened. Did you the giver get the response from the receiver you were looking for? Was the Christmas Jumper pulled over their head and worn of the rest of day or the next day or all week?

Obviously there are limitations; the child with the new bicycle will want to go out immediately though the weather will determine if that is at all possible and how long the accompanying adult is willing to enjoy the moment. Christmas 2019 was for me as busy as ever with many services in all the churches and then its 12.30 on Christmas Day and bang! It all comes to a halt, gone for another year and the question recurs each Boxing Day – is there nothing more?

Aside from the tinsel, turkey, decorated trees surely there is more; the history behind the feast of Christmas (told on least two TV programmes in the weeks leading Christmas Day) is routed in festivals dating back to pre-Christian times. Themes of sharing and love which we see in our giving of presents and helping those in more need than we are perhaps, are not just for Christmas. Christina Rossetti wrote:

Love came down at Christmas, Love all lovely, love divine; Love was born at Christmas, Star and angels gave the sign.

The love born at Christmas came as the Son of God. It was so great an event that God willed to prepare for it over the centuries, until 2000+ years ago God shared his love with all of us. As the New Year unfolds and with it uncertainty about many aspects of life, as the decorations come down and the daily routine is restored, be certain that the love of God will be there all year, and next. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH ALERT

Based on a Neighbourhood Watch report there have been incidents at an address in each of Ousden and Chedburgh, external lockable letter boxes were broken in to and post stolen. The information obtained in one case was used to open a Santander bank account with card and overdraft facility. There were signs that the box was raided again later, possibly to intercept the card. The overdraft was swiftly run up and the card used at stores. Exactly the same thing is thought to have happened at the other address.

The bank probably only checked the credit standing and electoral roll information of the genuine name and address before opening the account and extending credit. It would however require the criminal to intercept the debit/credit card when it subsequently arrived in the post.

You are at most risk if:

- you have an external letterbox
- it is not locked and robust
- it is accessible from the roadside
- the presence of post is visible you leave post in it for long periods during the day

Although innocent victims are unlikely to be held accountable for any loss, they have the considerable inconvenience of reporting and resetting their affairs with worry that it may happen again.

To reduce risk consider a lockable letter box, a non-return flap, a chute or arrangement such that the presence of post cannot be seen, access for retrieval only on the side away from the road and prompt clearance after delivery.

If your letterbox is broken in to,

• photograph the damage and report it to the police (online form may be easier than 101) to obtain a crime number. This will help establish your innocence if a fraud does occur.

• for four weeks after the crime arrange for your post to be removed from the box promptly after delivery (eg ask a neighbour if you are out all day) to avoid interception of any bank card delivery.

• if a bank card or post arrives pointing to a new account being opened for you, telephone the bank immediately and ask for their fraud department.



Fly-tipping

Find out how to report fly-tipping and prevent your rubbish being fly-tipped by others.

What is fly-tipping?

Fly-tipping is the illegal dumping of rubbish. It is punishable by a maximum sentence of 5 years imprisonment and the possibility of an unlimited fine on conviction.

Fly-tipping:

- can seriously pollute watercourses and contaminate land.
- can endanger human health, wildlife and livestock.
- is unsightly, spoiling our communities and the quality of life for local residents.
- is seen as a major problem by over three quarters of landowners and affects 67% of farmers.
- undermines legitimate businesses who are undercut by illegal operators.
- encourages others to dump more waste.



Report fly-tipping

Your local waste collection authority clears fly-tipping on public land.

Alternatively, you can report bigger incidents of fly-tipping by calling the Environment Agency's 24 hour Hot Line on 0800 807 060. They investigate incidents with a greater potential to cause harm to human health and damage to the environment.

Any information you supply will be treated in strictest confidence in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998.

Tips for reporting

Witnesses are vitally important in enabling action to be taken against people who fly-tip rubbish.

It will be useful for you to record the following information:

- Time and date of incident
- Description of person(s) dumping rubbish
- Description of vehicle(s) involved, including registration numbers
- Description of the rubbish dumped
- Photographs can also be very useful, but only if it is safe to do so
- Keep any notes you make at the time, even scribbled ones, as they can be very valuable as evidence.
- Stay safe do not confront fly-tippers.

Do not look for clues in the waste yourself, as there may be harmful items hidden in it.

Prevent fly-tipping



Householders should always check waste is being disposed of by a **registered waste carrier**. You can check the register of waste carriers on the EA website here.

If waste is dumped on private land, landowners have to clear it at their own expense.


