

Estate Charity of Thomas Rogeron (usually known as Rogerons or Rogeron Trust)

Brief history: Towards the end of the 1800s a Trust was set up in order to ease the administration of the assets (money, buildings and land) of a raft of small charities which "belonged" to the village. At least one of these goes back 300 years. There are 3 associated charities: the overarching Estate Charity of Thomas Rogeron, Hundon Relief in Need (which has also been known as Hundon Trust Fund) and Hundon Educational Fund. The former 2 are administered by the main Board of Trustees; the latter is administered by a separate group of Trustees, with a least one who is also a member of the principal Board. The main Board of Trustees consists of 3 people nominated by the Parish Council (see below in italics), 3 co-options and "the incumbent at the time being". At one time, the Trust owned considerable amounts of land and some buildings; however, much of this has been sold off over the years. At present it owns approximately 37 acres of farmland, which are let to a local business and a farmer, and 7 acres of allotment land. To aid the Trustees in managing this land they have the expertise of Mr David Smith, from Percival & Co of Earls Colne.

Main Board Trustees: Mr Phil Impey (Chair), Mr Joe Davis, Mr Tom McLardy, Rev Canon Stuart Mitchell (as current incumbent), Mrs Jane Morse, Mrs Sanchia Turner, Miss Sarah Upson (Clerk). These people are also Trustees of the Relief in Need (RIN) Charity.

<u>Hundon Educational Fund (HEF) Trustees:</u> Mr Bernard Beer (Chair & Clerk), Mrs Daniels, (Mrs Mary Evans), Mr Phil Impey, Rev Canon Stuart Mitchell, Mrs Sharon Monroe.

Finance: The main purpose of the Rogeron Trust is to disperse the excess funds it receives (known as the Dividend). Much of this income is derived from interest earned on stocks and share holdings, which have been selected for their safety and reliability. That portfolio is managed by the Charities Official Investment Fund; an arrangement recommended by the Charity Commissioners. The dispersal of this income is controlled by statute, namely 1/2 to Hundon Educational Fund, 1/3 to the Church and 1/6 to Relief in Need. The Education Foundation benefits many, from pre-school to university and beyond, whilst Relief in Need seeks to help those less fortunate than others. The main Trust is required, by law, to prepare an annual set of accounts, and does so. Both the main Charity's and RIN accounts are independently audited by Ensors, at no cost to the Charities. Copies of the balance sheets are submitted to the Parish Council AGM, together with a short report, the latter also being published in the Herald (*see NB at end of article). The main Trust also has to submit its accounts and an annual report to the Charity Commission. The Relief in Need Charity is not covered by this law, as its income is relatively small; however, the Trustees wish to do this. Hundon Educational Fund also prepares a set of audited accounts which are submitted to the main Trustees for scrutiny, as all the income is derived from the main Trust. Of course, it is not possible to publish anything which may lead to any beneficiary being identified, including how much the 2 associated charities receive. However, approximately £10K - £15K has been

awarded annually to many individuals and organisations in the Parish. Naturally the amounts vary according to income which, to a very large extent, is dictated by the rise and fall of the bank interest rate and the performance of the stock market. Any resident of the Parish of Hundon is entitled to benefit from RIN and HEF and all are invited to apply, in writing, through the two Clerks. The Boards of Trustees only meet, on average, two or three times a year. Naturally all applications are treated in absolute confidence.

*The annual report presented at the village AGM is for the previous year. However, the accounts are for the year prior to that (ie: about 15 months earlier). This is because our financial year follows the calendar year and we don't have time to get our accounts audited in the 3 months prior to the meeting, due to various things like statements not being available in time.

The Trusts are independent bodies in law; the Trustees of which are responsible only to the Charity Commissioners. The way in which the Trusts are managed, how they conduct their financial affairs, as well as their overall performances, are all overseen by the Charity Commissioners. The Trusts are subjected to the same legislation and supervision as any other charity. The Trustees receive no benefit, financial or otherwise, with even the Clerks claiming very little in the way of expenses. The Trusts, which are a huge and valuable asset to the community, have existed for a very long time, and benefited a great many parishioners and organisations.

LETTER FROM THE CURATE

I love candles. They can be aromatic or plain — I don't mind which, I just like them. Any shape or colour will do. I always use them when I take home communion services, or when I'm at the care home. There's something rather special and meaningful when the single flame shines throughout the short service - without the warmth of candlelight it's palpable that there's an important facet missing.

During Advent, we lit the candles each Sunday on the Advent Wreath – three purple, one pink, and then on Christmas Day, the white one in the centre. Each candle represents the Christmas story – from the patriarchs to the prophets, from John the Baptist to the Virgin Mary, and then the white one known as 'Christ's candle'. I wonder if this is where the tradition of lighting candles on birthday cakes comes from!

Our baptism candidates always receive a candle that is lit from our Paschal candle - it symbolises the light of Christ that now shines in the life of every newly baptised candidate. We encourage the families to relight the candle on the anniversary of the baptism, to remind them of God's love and grace and the light of Christ that came into the world to dispel the darkness; it's a light that continues to shine in their lives. I like to think of this as a flame of hope.

February, sometimes dark and often dreary, is lit up equally well by the flame of hope, and never better than on 2nd February, known as Candlemas, which can be traced to pre-Christian times when it was called the 'festival of light' that marked the halfway point between the shortest day of the year (22 December) and the spring equinox (20 March). Folklore suggests that the weather for the rest of the season could be predicted on Candlemas Day:

If Candlemas Day be fair and bright Winter will have another fight. If Candlemas Day brings cloud and rain, Winter won't come again!

Our farmers may have other suggestions to make of course!

For Christians, Candlemas represents the day when we think of the purification of Mary because it's 40 days after she gave birth to Jesus; this practice stems back to old Jewish tradition when women were not allowed in the temple to worship until purification had taken place. It is on this day that Mary and Joseph presented Jesus to God as an act of thanksgiving; and waiting for them at the temple were the prophets Simeon and Anna – they had been expecting the Messiah, although they had no idea when. It was Simeon who blessed Jesus and called him 'a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel'. And so at Candlemas, there are more candles of course, and it's on this day that the church candles for the rest of the year are blessed.

What's good about candles is we can use them throughout the year, regardless of season. Perhaps like me you may marvel how a single flame – the flame of hope and the light of Christ – can light up even the darkest corner of our lives. As we move towards Easter that light will shine even more prominently.

HUNDON PARISH COUNCIL FULL MINUTES WILL BE AVAILABLE ON THE HUNDON PARISH COUNCIL WEBSITE

Hundon Parish Council met on Wednesday 15th January 2020

The Precept was approved and served upon the District Council.

The date of election of a Parish Councillor was taking place on 30th January 2020.

There had been no further progress on the VAS machine, Clerk to follow up on this.

The Parish Council had previously agreed that a working group for village planning matters is to be set up. This group will be headed up by Councillor Langridge and consist of councillors and volunteer members of the public. Councillor Langridge advised that he was waiting to hear back from West Suffolk Planning regarding which Planning Officer was responsible for developments in Hundon. Councillor Jean Thomas agreed to join the working group. Councillor Langridge was keen to give regular updates and to organise public engagement.

Painting of the bus shelter was on hold until a suitable window in the weather.

Councillor Jean Thomas was elected as Parish Council representative on the Hundon Education Foundation Board.

It has been arranged for some Parish Councillors to visit Rougham Service Delivery Centre to meet with Suffolk Highways Officers to discuss issues in Hundon. Various issues to be raised included pot holes, inadequate repair to road surfaces, drainage and village signs.

Public Forum

A member of public raised some questions on the 2020/21 budget, i) the figures against councillor expenses and ii) low budget assigned for dog bins. Previously the figure for dog bins had been much higher, due to there being a charge from the District Council for emptying them. On this note, the member of public raised that the dog bins at Brockley Green, Mill Road and at the allotments had not been emptied. The Clerk to report this to the District Council and to enquire as to why there had been no invoice received for emptying them.

A member of public asked why the Council Agenda had included Wildspace. It was explained that as there were new council members and staff on the Council, it would be beneficial for an update from those who knew about this project. The member of public explained that she had been Chair of this group, but due to a change in focus at the local school, the group had not continued, although it still held funds. The member of public, Councillors Impey and Spooner then continued to mention that the group had taken on projects around the village such as tree planting and ditch clearing.

The Chairman thanked them for the information and it was then suggested that she would find out if there was still some interest in reviving this group and that this could be brought forward to a future agenda. A member of public requested that blocked drains in village be reported to the County Council, the clerk advised that she had reported these to the County Councillor Mary Evans.

The member of public also reported a pot hole at Lower North Street, adjacent the bus shelter, the Clerk to report. Councillor Spooner mentioned that there were lots of pot holes as well as mud on the road at Mill Road, the Clerk informed the council that she had reported the mud and that the pot holes had already been reported on the reporting tool.






