West Suffolk Local Plan - The first draft of the Housing Needs Survey has been completed and the final draft is being prepared. A copy will be distributed to each household once completed.

Cllr C Callow gave thanks to the members of the working party for their commitment and hard work in preparing the Housing Needs Survey.

The working party are now preparing next steps in preparation for the next stage of the West Suffolk Plan consultation due next year.

Headway Charity – It was agreed to donate £150 to support the Headway Charity.

Grit Bin – Highways agreed the new grit bin for the Corner at Steeplechase. A new grit bin for the corner of Hall Road was refused by Highways.

<u>Update from WSC – Cllr M Rushbrook, Cllr K Richardson, Cllr N Clarke</u> Covid-19

Suffolk has just been granted the extra national resources that it asked for to help fight the rising number of cases of COVID-19 that we are facing.

West Suffolk Council (WSC) was part of the Suffolk Local Outbreak Engagement Board discussions that backed this request to Government and was on the call with the Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Vaccines and Public Health Maggie Throup on Friday 29 Octobre when

the additional support, funding and resources to help the NHS avoid unsustainable pressure, were agreed.

The additional support includes:

- Extra localised COVID-19 testing, often known as 'surge testing'
- Logistical support to maximise vaccine take up and help deliver door knocking campaigns
- Additional control measures in schools
- Communications funding and support
- Fast tracked escalation of issues through the Government's emergency response decision making processes

Funding to support households

The Government has recently announced funding to support households with housing costs. This briefing note sets out the key funding streams and the criteria used for the allocation of the funds.

In all instances where households are struggling with their housing costs, they should be encouraged to speak to the housing team about their situation who will then identity the best option for financial and other support (if applicable). For other financial advice, WSC will continue to refer customers to the Suffolk Support and Advice Service (SASS), a service set up specifically to support individuals and families to access support since the onset of the pandemic.

The following funding is available for the housing team to allocate, and they will do this sequentially to ascertain if the household situation meets the criteria of the individual funds.

- 1. Discretionary Housing Payment (DHP) This is not a new fund and has been around for many years. Eligibility for DHP is assessed by Anglia Revenues Partnership (ARP) but the housing team also have an input. This will be the first fund to be considered by the housing team and must be spent by 31 March 2022.
- 2. Household Support Fund (HSF) This is a new fund announced by government on 30.9.21. This is paid to upper tier authorities (Suffolk County Council). The vast majority of SCC's £5million allocation will go to free school meals; holiday clubs; and a targeted approach to the most vulnerable in the county (details of this element of the funding should be directed to SCC. Of the £5million, £1 million has been allocated to district housing teams across Suffolk (the amount per district has yet to be agreed) to help with housing costs. This must be spent by 31.3.22.
- 3.Homelessness Prevention Grant (HPG) Winter 2021 Covid-19 rent arrears financial support announced on 23 October 2021 under the headline 'support for vulnerable renters', this is a top up of the council's existing Homelessness Prevention Grant. Of the £65 million additional funding, West Suffolk has been allocated £137,593, on top of our existing allocation of £656,214. The government's expectation is that we use the fund to maximise homelessness prevention for low-income private renters in COVID-19 related rent arrears in particular. Whilst there is no deadline for the allocation of this funding, there is an expectation that the top up award is allocated over the winter.

What is Mindfulness

Mindfulness is a simple and very powerful practice of training our attention. It's simple in that it's really just about paying attention to what's happening here and now (i.e. sensations, thoughts, and emotions) in a non-judgemental way. It's powerful because it can interrupt the habit of getting lost in thoughts, mostly about the future or past, which often generates more stress on top of the real pressures of everyday life.

Science suggests that mind-wandering freely to more pleasant and playful thoughts may improve our mood and foster creativity.

Remember to breathe

- Inhaling up the right side of the square pause –
- exhale along the top of the square pause -
- inhale down the left side of the square pause
- exhale along the bottom of the square pause

Dietary tips for winter

Vitamin D Sources include:

- oily fish such as salmon, sardines, herring and mackerel
- red meat
- liver
- egg yolks
- fortified foods such as some fat spreads and breakfast cereals

Vitamin D plays a significant role in the regulation of calcium and maintenance of phosphorus levels in the blood. These factors are vital for maintaining healthy bones. People need vitamin D to allow the intestines to stimulate and absorb calcium and reclaim calcium that the kidneys would otherwise excrete. Vitamin D has other roles in the body, including reduction of inflammation as well as modulation of such processes as cell growth, neuromuscular and immune function, and glucose metabolism. HUNDON ALLOTMENT FIELD UPDATE



More Trees

This winter we are planning to double the size of the community orchard and to plant a range of trees around the field. Additional fruit and nut trees planned

include additional pears, gages and apples (including cooking apples) but also filbert/Kent Cob, elder, cherry and damson.

We intend to plant some small trees such as walnut and black mulberry alongside some of the paths through the field as well as some taller trees at the bottom of the wildflower meadow and alongside the brook, though not all of these will be planted this winter. The taller trees will include the native black poplar which is now one of Britain's rarest trees. The black poplar is a large tree, with a thick, fissured trunk, that can be found on floodplains, around flooded gravel pits and along ditches. It is particularly prevalent in Shropshire, Cheshire, Somerset, the Vale of Aylesbury and East Anglia, but populations have declined massively over the years. Black poplars have formed an important part of our landscape and culture for centuries, from being landmarks and a focus for celebration, to inspiring the famous painter, Constable, and providing timber for floorboards.

We hope to have a **planting day**, supported by the Sicon Foundation, on Sunday 23rd January. Please put the date in your diary. More details next month.

Sloes

We have now had our first frosts which means that sloes are now ready to be picked. These are the small purple fruit of the blackthorn, which is thought to be the wild ancestor of domesticated plum and damson varieties. The berries are high in tannins which make them very astringent with a dry mouth-feel if eaten raw. They are also very sour. But beneath all that, they have an intense plummy flavour which can be released in infusions with sugar - such as sloe gin!

There are loads of sloes in the hedgerow from Church Street down to the lower Rogeron Close entry. Please feel very welcome to pick them.

Sloe Gin recipe Ingredients 500g ripe sloes

250g golden caster sugar

1 litre gin

Method

Step 1: Rinse and pick over the sloes, then pat dry in a clean tea towel. Using a stainless steel fork or cocktail stick, prick the sloes and tip into a 2-litre glass jar, or divide between two smaller jars.

Step 2: Add the sugar and gin, then seal the jar. Shake well. Once a day for seven days, give the jar a good shake. Store the jar in a cool, dark place and leave for two to three months.

Step 3: Line a plastic sieve with a square of muslin set over a bowl and strain the sloe gin through it. Decant into clean, dry bottles, then seal and label. The sloe gin is now ready to drink but it'll improve and mature over time – so, if possible, make it one year to drink the next

Sloe gin doesn't have to be drunk as it is, it is also very good in cocktails; put into fruit sauces with game or into puddings!

WEST SUFFOLK LOCAL PLAN AND HUNDON HOUSING SURVEY

Update from Parish Council

As you will be aware recent Hundon Heralds have included information about the West Suffolk Planning consultation process that is currently underway to determine potential housing needs and development options across West Suffolk for the next twenty years.

During September the Parish Council Working Group issued a confidential questionnaire to all 460 properties in the parish to help understand our anticipated housing needs and requirements for the future to feed into that consultation process. We also gathered views on associated issues regarding any potential growth for the village.

We had approximately 200 responses which has given us some broad indicators suggesting that Hundon may benefit from some limited growth to cater primarily for the elderly looking to downsize or find manageable properties, and first-time buyers.

Estimating housing needs across the next twenty years is obviously an inexact science due to the wide range of variables concerned. Some needs will be met by the normal levels of movement but this will be primarily houses and bungalows sold at the relatively high market values of existing properties in the village – which may be suitable for most of those seeking to downsize but which will remain out of reach for first time buyers. Some very broad forecasts can be drawn from the figures provided which will need to be explored in more detail to determine firmer conclusions.

As anticipated there were firm views against any large scale development or <u>any</u> housing on the allotment site and concerns that roads, sewage and drainage are improved before any new housing is considered.

The Parish Council has drafted an initial report on the survey results and is considering a range of proposals to adopt some broad principles and objectives that should underpin any future development - both in terms of scale and types of housing - should any sites be allocated by West Suffolk. These principles will guide our responses to the next stage of the consultation process next year and are also included in the survey report.

The initial survey report will be available via the Hundon Village Facebook page and the Parish Council Website in the next few days and printed copies will be delivered to all households with the January copy of the Herald. (A number of printed copies will also be available in the village shop shortly for those interested but without Web/Facebook access).

From Richard Langridge:

We were recently sorting out the books for sale in the Church and found the following article about Hundon which may interest readers of the Hundon Herald.

Hundon, called "Hundendana" in the Domesday Book of 1086, is the second largest parish in West Suffolk. It is a scattered village which includes the hamlets of Scotch Green, Babel Green and Brockley Green, and is situated about six miles from Haverhill and four miles from Clare, with its main north-south street centred around the church of All Saints and the United Reform church which was built as an Independent chapel in 1846.

In the 1890s most Hundon people worked in or around the village as corn millers, tailors, wheelwrights, bootmakers, saddlers, blacksmiths, farmers, butchers and bakers. Today this is the exception, people travelling sometimes as far as London on a daily basis; gone is the horse-drawn farm equipment and the driving of herds of animals to market on foot- all is now mechanised. In the 1930s there were eight public houses or alehouses in the village - there are now only two; but unlike many villages, Hundon has retained two shops and the post office.

All Saints Church, whose register dates from 1642, suffered a severe fire in 1914, losing five of its six bells, and was rebuilt in 1916. In 1929 Canon Arthur Wasket came to All Saints as his first living, and remained for 52 years until his death in 1981. During his time in Hundon he published a book of poems, and was an accomplished water-colourist. In 1687 the church sexton, while digging a grave, unearthed 200 Anglo-Saxon coins. each worth 4d. Jackie Blackcap was a "gentleman of the highway" whose round included Hundon, and it was not uncommon for him to sleep in the church porch.

Some of the oldest surviving houses are Hundon Hall; "Thatchers" which was originally a hall-house; Pinhoe Hall, at one time a moated house; and Workhouse Yard which was built in 1737. There are houses of every period in the village, including an unobtrusive modern development.

The approach to Scotch Green is called Steeplechase Terrace, which is reminiscent of the horse racing which took place in the 1730s for the prize of a pair of silver spurs. This must have been quite a festive occasion, for footmen could run for a prize of ten shillings, and also ten pairs of gloves could be won by young men in a football game.

In 1936 much of the parish was bought by the Air Ministry for the building of an aerodrome. This was opened in February 1938, and was named RAF Stradishall (Hundon) to avoid confusion with the existing RAF Hendon.

RAF Stradishall closed in August 1970, but a few years later the buildings housed the refugee Asians from Uganda. The establishment is now Highpoint Prison.

Until the building of the village hall in 1956, the school provided the venue for many functions. Built by local volunteers with help from the Quaker community, the Hall now accommodates all the village organisations from the play group, through all ages and interests, to the Evergreen Club.


