GRANTS FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES

If you need financial assistance to pay fees for educational courses (including music and sports), for educational outings, for books or fees for students at college or university, or for any other educational purpose, then you can apply for a grant.

Applications

Please apply by email and include your bank sort code, account number and the exact account name. Then any grant will be transferred directly into your bank and you will be informed by email. This will save us all handling cheques and is secure PROVIDED you are careful to give accurate sort codes, account numbers and the exact account name as it is difficult or impossible to recover monies sent to the wrong place.

To be considered for a grant, you must:

Be under the age of 25 or making an application in respect of a person under 25.

Reside within the Parish of Hundon.

Please apply by email giving the following information:

Age of student. Your sort code and account number and the exact account name. Details of your application.

Due to restricted funds the trustees cannot normally make grants for routine traveling expenses.

The 2022/23 budget was set at the Parish Council meeting on 19^{th} January 2022. The expected net expenditure for 2022/23 is £32,605 with £11,700 coming from reserves and £20,905 coming from the precept. Full details of the budget and precept are available on the Parish Council website.

<u>Trees in Galley Road</u> – The clerk has received confirmation regarding the ownership of the trees and will explore this further with West Suffolk Council.

<u>Update from WSC – Cllr M Rushbrook, Cllr K</u> <u>Richardson, Cllr N Clarke</u> Update from West Suffolk Council (WSC) regarding the

pandemic WSC has been working to support residents and businesses throughout this pandemic, and to date have administered more than £120m in business grants and rate relief.

Omicron variant of COVID-19 is now having an impact on our businesses, WSC will once again be working to administer further Government support to businesses, through grants and rate relief, over the next couple of months.

Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant (OHLG)

Launched on 17 January 2022, this is one-off grant of up to $\pounds 6,000$ for hospitality, leisure and accommodation businesses in the business rates system, whose trade has been impacted by the rise of the Omicron variant of COVID -19.

The grant is subject to Government criteria, referenced in the guidelines at <u>www.westsuffolk.gov.uk/coronavirus/</u> <u>business-support/upload/COVID19-Omicron-Hospitality-</u> <u>and-Leisure-Grant-Scheme-Eligibility-Criteria.pdf</u> Due to fraud prevention and Government pre-payment checks that WSC have to adhere to, they are unable to make automatic grant payments to previous grant recipients on this occasion. Businesses will instead need to make a new application for this payment.

Businesses should apply at <u>www.westsuffolk.gov.uk/</u> <u>c19business</u>. The closing date for applications is 18 February 2022. Grants will be paid out once pre-payment checks have taken place. All OHLG grants are to be paid out no later than 31 March 2022.

Omicron Additional Restrictions Grant (Omicron ARG)

The Government has given WSC £310,000 to offer discretionary grants to West Suffolk businesses. They are currently working through the detail given by Government and are aiming to launch a local discretionary scheme early in the week of 24 January 2022.

Due to the limited level of funding available WSC will invite applications to be made by 20 February, after which they will decide on grant amounts based on evidence of the scale of impact on trade and other criteria. This does mean that no ARG grants can be paid until March 2022 and based on modelling of numbers from previous applications they expect the levels of payment may be relatively small compared to those paid previously.

Businesses should look on the <u>www.westsuffolk.gov.uk/</u> <u>c19business</u> webpage as well as the Council's social media for updates nearer the time.

In line with Government advice, all the previous ARG money allocated to the Council by the Government in late 2020 and early 2021, has already been paid out to help businesses survive last winter, reopen in a COVID-secure manner and to support business recovery.

COVID-19 Additional Relief Fund (CARF)

The Government has announced the above to help businesses that have not previously been eligible for rate relief during the pandemic.

The fund will support councils in delivering a local discretionary scheme. WSC will be going through the Government guidance and modelling a scheme to distribute the rate relief to those businesses that need it the most and who have not already been helped.

WSC aim is to implement this rate relief to businesses ahead of their annual billing in March. Please see <u>www.westsuffolk.gov.uk/c19business</u> webpage where the council will have more detail to share.

<u>Rectors Ramblings – February 2022</u> (Love and Marriage)

Dear Friends,

I rather like February as a month. It is an odd month, shorter than all the others; it seems to have been squeezed in between the depression of a post-Christmas January, and the promised spring of March. It is the 'Month of Love' with St Valentine featuring prominently for many.

For me February isn't about an *(overpriced)* romantic meal with someone special, particularly as I have yet to find that someone special myself; but February is a time when I do get to think quite a bit about love, as one of the most wonderful things I will get to do this year is officiate at a lot more weddings in the 6 churches in the benefice than in recent years thanks to an easing of COVID restrictions and the fact that many couples now have more confidence that they will be able to have the wedding celebration that they want. In fact, COVID aside, after years of decline, more and more couples are once again choosing to get married in Church, and nationally more than one in three of all weddings will take place in Church of England Churches.

But what is so special about weddings and why does the Church believe that getting married in Church offers the very best way to start a life together as Husband and Wife? Well first off, the coming together of a man and a woman can be traced back to Adam and Eve, who "were made for each other" (Genesis 2). Jesus' own teaching on marriage tells us that it is exclusive, unbreakable and forges a new family unit. Indeed, Jesus' very first recorded miracle took place at a wedding reception: when he turned water into wine (John 2). The idea of marriage then is near on universal, with practically every country and culture on earth recognising the special bond that is created in the act of marriage.

Marriage then has always been part of our loving God's plan for us, and it should therefore be no surprise that increasingly there is academic research which demonstrates that marriage is actually good for you! It states that:

· Marriage makes people far less likely to suffer mental health problems

- · Marriage makes people live much longer
- Marriage makes people healthier and happier

· Marriage may reduce stress

 $\cdot\,$ Marriage may help couples develop healthier habits and suppress bad ones.

 $\cdot\,$ A spouse also makes it more likely that there will be someone there to care in times of illness.


Christians believe that marriage really is a gift from God, it therefore follows that a church wedding is the most appropriate place to make such a public commitment to another individual, and we believe that the additional spiritual element that is an essential part of a church wedding, really does transform a relationship to a new and deeper level.

In the marriage ceremony, a couple makes a public declaration of lifelong commitment to love each other. A commitment, which by its very nature is a challenging one; Saying 'I will' to those vows obliges you to forgive and be forgiven. It will be tough at times! So, marriage is a risk, but a risk worth taking. There's plenty of evidence to show married couples are more likely to be healthy, wealthy and wise!

Marriage can change couples for the better and as they change, so their marriage grows along with them. Marriage isn't "a magic bullet", and most married couples will from time to time fall short of God's ideal for love, but a degree of conflict in a marriage can be healthy if dealt with appropriately. But as a Christian I believe that marriage is a gift from God and should mirror the love God has for all of us – love that remains true, faithful, protective, and respectful.

So, if you believe that you have found the person whom you believe that God is calling you to share the rest of your life with – why not speak to me about getting married in your village or town church – a place where many couples have come together in love and faith for centuries!

This is illegal and antisocial towards the vehicle driver or pedestrian who crashes into the scooter. HUNDON ALLOTMENT FIELD UPDATE



Orchard Extension

We were delighted to welcome a team of volunteers from Sicon who supplied 30 additional fruit trees to extend our orchard and helped more than 30 volunteers from the village get them planted. We have added: Pear (Conference); Kent Cob; cooking apples Bramley Seedling; dessert apple James Grieve; Eeder; sweet

cherry; damson; Oullins Gage; walnut and black mulberry.





Update on remedial tree work

The weather has been so wet that the field has been inaccessible for the contractor. He will get on with it as soon as the ground conditions permit.

Housing survey and the Allotment Field

We were interested to read the Parish Council's comprehensive housing survey report, though we were unsurprised to see that the responses showed 94% against development on the allotment field.

HATA's request for the Rogeron Trust to show its good will by withdrawing the site from the Suffolk Strategic plan was rejected by the Trust last year. The Parish Council have now formally requested the withdrawal in the light of the housing survey results. We await the Trust's response with interest, and hope, should they again refuse, that they explain to their reasoning to the community.

Parish Council Grant – HATA Hub

We are delighted to announce that the Parish Council has further demonstrated its support of HATA's plans for the allotment field by awarding us a grant of £2000 towards our planned HATA Hub. Over the winter (if it gets a bit drier!) we intend to use last year's grant from Mary Evans to renovate Jimmy's Shed. Then the Parish Council grant will be used towards the erection of a summerhouse nearby, eventually with power and water. This will act as a base for our volunteers, where we can provide somewhere to shelter out of the rain and enjoy tea and coffee!

We intend to buy tables and chairs so it can also be used by the community for small meetings and educational events. If we can also build a sturdy awning and invest in foldaway tables, it can also easily be used for things like plant and cake sales etc.

HATA plans for 2022

We have loads of ideas of activities we would like to organise in 2022. Some will be just for the enjoyment of the community, others educational and involve monitoring the wildlife diversity of the field and improving the richness of the habitats.

We also intend to get involved in the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. We will share more over the coming months.
