### Allotment Field Update

Spring is now properly in the air and the allotment field is buzzing with activity as allotment holders get on with the main planting season. We are starting to see some early spring flowers on the wildflower meadow and along the sides of the ditch.

### Parish Council and HATA

HATA attended the March Parish Council meeting. We are grateful that the Parish Council has funded the majority of our expected expenditure for the Jubilee Events we are hosting. More on this later! We also discussed the Financial Assessment and Risk Profile that HATA has put together following our first full year of responsibility for the allotments and 6 months for the whole field. HATA is in a strong position financially and organisationally. After due diligence, the Parish Council considers the risk of HATA failing to be so low that they have offered to underwrite HATA. This means that, in the very unlikely event of HATA collapsing at some time in the future, the Parish Council will ensure that the Rogeron Trust will not revert to a situation where some of their charitable funds need to be spent on field maintenance.

Finally we finished with some Ports of course; a fine Ruby, and a 20 year old Tawny.

### BROXTED COMMUNITY SOLAR FUND FOR HUNDON



This was established following the completion of the solar farm in 2014. To date the fund has award a total of £77,000 benefitting the Primary School, Pre-School and various clubs and organisations. We invite applications for this year and will welcome any that can be shown to bring material benefit to make our village an even better place in which to live and enjoy!

### **APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING – 2022**

The main features of the Community Fund are summarised: -

- This year the total amount awarded will be £10,500. This will include a direct annual payment of £1,500 to Hundon Primary School.
- The balance of £9,000 will be awarded to organisations or groups within Hundon. To receive an award from the Community Fund, an application must make a material change or create material benefit for the Community in and around Hundon, and may include revenue items as well as capital payments.
- The minimum award through the Community Fund will be £1,000 as any applicant must demonstrate 'material change' or 'material benefit' for the Community i.e. not narrowly focused or small in size or scope.
- The Community Fund is run by the Community Fund Group who will meet to discuss the merits of each application to determine whether or not they qualify for funding and if so how much will be awarded. At any one time the Group will consists of four members:
  - 1. The Chairman or Representative of the Parish Council—Geoff Spooner
  - 2. The Chairman or Representative of the Village Hall Committee—Martin Warner
  - 3. One other representative of the Hundon Community with wide knowledge and experience of it currently David Rowlinson who was Parish Council Chairman when the proposal for Broxted Solar was presented at a meeting which was also attended by Dorothy Whittaker who was Hundon's Borough Council at the time
  - 4. A representative of Navigator Land LLP, the owners of Broxted Estate (and hence landlords of Broxted Solar) the first such representative being Charles Ryder. David Rowlinson acts as Chairman of the Community Fund Group and Charles Ryder/Navigator Land LLP administers it.

If your club or organisation has a project requiring funding and which meets the above criteria, submit details of what any award will be used for and where it involves the purchase of equipment or services should include more than one quote. Please note that all applications must be for projects which required £1,000 or more and which will be completed within 1 year of receipt of the award.

## Applications should be emailed to Charles Ryder at charles@gbfco.com by 30<sup>th</sup> June.

During the ensuing two weeks, the Community Fund Group will consider the applications seeking, where necessary, further information. The Group will then make recommendations to Broxted Solar as to which applications should be awarded funding and payments are anticipated to be made by the end of August. Depending on that total sum requested from all applications, some which qualify may not receive an award this year, but such projects can apply again next year.

The community Fund Group looks forward to receiving applications in the coming weeks. We very much hope that Broxted Solar's Community Fund will continue to be of great benefit to the Community of Hundon over the coming years.

With Easter and the associated school holiday upon us, we wanted to share a further instalment from Hundon Community Primary School.

Like so many, we have had our share of challenges with regards the pandemic, including in recent weeks with high numbers of positive cases within our two schools. Fortunately, we have stayed open and operational, thanks in no small part to our children's parents and carers, who have been overwhelmingly supportive of our safety measures. This has undoubtedly contributed to our ability to minimise disruption to learning and ensure our children are safe, happy and engaged in the carefully crafted experiences our bespoke curriculum offers.

It is such a privilege to be in our school and see all our children building their knowledge and skills to support them in being motivated, independent and successful learners.



Since our last update, we have welcomed scientists from the Cambridge Science Centre who delivered hands-on, practical workshops introducing the children to environmental science as part of British Science Week and benefitted from specialist coaching in cricket from the England Cricket Board.











You will not be surprised to know our children were deeply affected by the news reports from the Ukraine and were keen to find ways to support. As a result, on Friday 25th March, the children at both our schools took part in a Ukrainian themed day, raising money for UNICEF and the Ukraine. As well as wearing yellow and blue to show support the children learnt much about the country's customs and traditions as well as the language and geography. Together, the children in our two schools raised over £400 for UNICEF.

Additionally, the children were thoroughly engaged in extending their thinking and deepening their reasoning skills as part of our moral development 'pause' day. Built around the story of Malala Yousafzai (the young Pakistani girl who stood up to the Taliban when they banned women from education) with each class exploring activities and dilemmas at an age appropriate level.

Most recently, Hawthorn Class and our oldest children, have been researching world leaders and their involvement in World War 2 as part of their 'A CHILD'S WAR' themed learning. In Oak Class, our



children in Years 3 and 4, have been learning the characteristics of rivers and mountain ranges around the world and in Cherry Class, our youngest children have continued with their 'MAGNIFICENT MONARCHS' theme, building up their understanding of the monarchy, their royal residences and the most significant sovereigns.







We have much to look forward to in the fast approaching summer term. Our youngest children in Cherry Class will start with the theme 'SPLENDID SKIES' and focus on developing their knowledge of weather and the seasons. Our children in Years 3 and 4, our Oak Class, will be learning about Anglo-Saxon and Viking culture, chronology and key events as part of their theme 'TRADERS AND RAIDERS'. In Hawthorn Class, our Year 5 and 6 children will be continuing their studies of the Second World War as part of their theme 'A CHILD'S WAR'.

We are also looking forward to our appointed contractor breaking ground for our wellbeing hub and the official grand re-opening of our sister school's pool. We will be holding our first, action-packed ACTIVITIES WEEK in which our children will experiment with new sports, including archery and golf, develop their team-building skills, contribute to the design and construction of a whole school art installation and get creative with photography, amongst other things, all of which will culminate in a whole school exhibition!

Our pupils are, as always, at the centre of everything we do, they help make Hundon and Thurlow Primary Federation the unique and inspiring learning community it is.

# THE RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS: IMMORTALITY OR ETERNAL LIFE

Dear Friends,

Yesterday I realised that I may not be immortal after all

To be honest I have always suspected that might be the case, but I didn't really want to face up to the reality. For the past 26 months I have worked constantly throughout the pandemic. During the worst of it I administered 'last rites' to the dying, met with families to arrange funerals, supported Doctors, Nurses, Carers and Funeral Directors, delivered medicines and food parcels to those isolating at home, all the while taking necessary precautions, and managed to not catch COVID. In fact, I had reached the stage where I began to believe that despite being triple vaccinated, I was naturally immune. It turns out that I am not! A week before Easter I received the long feared 'double red lines' of a lateral flow test.

Now as I write this, I don't feel too terrible, I have the aches, and lethargy, the running nose, and a cough, but although I am isolating in the Vicarage I can at least do some work, albeit interspersed with mugs of Lemsip. However, in the back of my mind, I cannot escape the memory that just 6 months ago, my Father died of COVID, and there was always the possibility it could be me as well.

As your parish priest I have the enormous privilege of conducting many funerals and thanksgiving services, and I hope that in doing so I help families to say their final farewells to their loved ones. Funerals are of course a time when those attending are also faced with the fact that our earthly lives do come to an end. They mark the point when we no longer see the person we love, as it says in the Prayer Book, "In the midst of life we are in death".

Whilst physical immortality isn't possible, despite what technology or artificial engineering continue to explore, a different immortality is possible after death because as we are reminded each Easter, Jesus died on the cross so that we could indeed have eternal life.

Our regular celebration of the Eucharist is proof of our immortality. It reminds us that our eternal life comes about through death – death to self and death to sin, and that is only possible though the work of Jesus and culminating in his death and resurrection, and not through anything that you or I have done.

St Paul encouraged us when he wrote, "But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Saviour from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body" (Philippians 3:20-21).

So, whilst I may not be immortal after all, I do look forward to an eternal life, thanks to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Please keep safe and well, and be assured of my prayers for you all.

#### **CLARE CASTLE COUNTRY PARK**

As the days lengthen our thoughts inevitably turn to spending time outdoors and, maybe, taking more exercise! The Country Park has much to offer here. In addition to its 36 acres of green spaces and expanded children's play area for informal leisure activities, it offers two free events every week. Every Saturday at 9 am there is a 5K Park Run, part of the national scheme, and, for the less strenuously minded, there is a 3K circular walk at 10.30 each Tuesday. There is also a heritage themed trim trail in the Park with 5 pieces of apparatus that require participants to exhibit the physical skills and stamina that would have been required many years ago in building the railway or working within the wool industry.



Park Run is a wonderfully inclusive event that attracts people of all ages and abilities, with well over 100 runners, walkers and volunteer marshals demonstrating incredible camaraderie every week. Details of how to sign up as a participant or marshal can be found at <a href="https://www.clarecastleparkrun.co.uk">www.clarecastleparkrun.co.uk</a> If you decide to get involved, you can be assured of a warm welcome. You are guaranteed an equally friendly time on the Tuesday walk, which is part of the Suffolk wellbeing walks organised through OneLifeSuffolk, with the Clare walk managed by Clare Walkers (www.clarewalks.co.uk).

Continuing the exercise theme, the Park is hosting the finish of the Bury to Clare Challenge Run/Walk in aid of St Nicholas Hospice on Sunday 8 May, and the launch of the Suffolk Walking Festival on Saturday 14 May. For the latter event it is a case of third time lucky, as the Festival was cancelled in both 2020 and 2021. There are over 70 walks, of varying lengths, across the County in just 15 days. Details of the walks and how to book are given in the Festival brochure that is available from our Visitor Centre, or by visiting



www.suffolkwalkingfestival.co.uk. Clare Walkers have entered 5 walks, including the 7 mile Clare and Cavendish Circular on Saturday 28 May. There are also a number of walks in and around Cavendish, Long Melford and Sudbury. The Festival presents a unique opportunity to experience guided walks in a diversity of settings right across Suffolk, and it is well worth getting involved.

Plans are now advanced for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations in the Park. On Thursday 2 June at 9.15 pm the beacon in the Park will be lit, as it will be in many communities across the UK. Entertainment will be provided by local schoolchildren and nourishment by Platform One café, which will be supplying hot drinks, burgers and other snacks. On Friday 3 June there will be a Royalty-themed family trail (look out for Elizabeth de Burgh, Lady of Clare, and the royal train!), whilst on the Saturday there will be a 'Party in the Park' organised by the Town Council, with live music. The weekend will be rounded off by a family fun day on the Playing Field on Sunday the 4<sup>th</sup>.
