There is a long and unbroken tradition in our country of celebrating Royal Jubilees, Weddings and Coronations with the lighting of beacons - on top of mountains, church and cathedral towers, castle battlements, on town and village greens, country estates, parks and farms, along beaches and on cliff tops. In 1897, beacons were lit to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee. In 1977, 2002 and 2012, beacons commemorated the Silver, Golden and Diamond Jubilees of The Queen, and in 2016 Her Majesty's 90th birthday.

On 2nd June 2022, we will celebrate another unique milestone in our history, Her Majesty The Queen's 70th year as our Monarch and Head of the Commonwealth - her Platinum Jubilee. It is a feat no previous monarch has achieved. More than 2,022 beacons will be lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories, and one in each of the capital cities of Commonwealth countries in recognition of The Queen's long and selfless service. The beacons will enable local communities, individuals and organisations to pay tribute to her as part of the official Platinum Jubilee Weekend of celebrations from 2nd to 5th June 2022.

- Free Burgers at the BBQ, social gathering, music and other activities, and the bar will be open in the hall.
- There will be a 'Flaming Torchlight' procession around the village at 8.45pm approximately returning to the village hall in time for the beacon lighting at 9.45pm. Children should bring along their own battery torches or lamps to add to the spectacle.

The 'Hundon Beacon' will be lit at 9.45pm at the official time for all beacons across the country.

### FROM SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHWAYS

For your information, we are planning to carry out pre surface dressing road repairs, surface dressing and associated works along B1063 Clare/Hundon and Stradishall, as detailed below. The works are programmed to take place between 23 May and 10 June 2022, excluding the Bank Holiday weekend. The roads will be closed between 9am and 3pm each day to ensure that we can carry out our works safely.

Phase 1 - B1063 Chilton Street, Clare (from Poslingford Corner to Folly Road)

Phase 2 - B1063 Folly Road, Clare and B1063 Folly Road, Hundon

Phase 3 - B1063 Stradishall Road, Hundon, B1063 Edmunds Hill, Stradishall and B1063 The Street, Stradishall

For the duration of the road closure, traffic will be diverted via B1063, A143, B1061, A1017, A1092, B1063 and vice versa.

As we plan roadworks in advance, we schedule extra days to allow for bad weather or other delays beyond our control. If we need to make major changes to our work dates, we will update the information signs on site.

When we close the road and put a diversion in place, the route needs to be accessible to vehicles of all shapes and sizes. We make our diversions as clear as possible by placing appropriate signing along the route. The latest updates on our works can be found on our website at "Temporary road closures for Suffolk Highways roadworks" and on <u>One.Network</u> website.

#### Village Matters

<u>Crossroads and footpath signs</u> – The Parish Council are aware these need repairing. These are the responsibility of Suffolk County Council, but unfortunately as these are not statutory signs they are not high on the list of Suffolk's works to be completed. The Parish Council have plans to replace the sign at the crossroads and are currently discussing with Suffolk County Council the logistics of this.

<u>Grants</u> - The Parish Council has given the Hundon Music Festival Committee £400 to support a free music festival in August. Extra funding has been given for the maintenance of the churchyard and this will be reviewed again in October for budget preparation for 2023/2024.

### **BROXTED COMMUNITY SOLAR FUND FOR HUNDON**



This was established following the completion of the solar farm in 2014. To date the fund has award a total of £77,000 benefitting the Primary School, Pre-School and various clubs and organisations. We invite applications for this year and will welcome any that can be shown to bring material benefit to make our village an even better place in which to live and enjoy!

### **APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING – 2022**

The main features of the Community Fund are summarised: -

- This year the total amount awarded will be £10,500. This will include a direct annual payment of £1,500 to Hundon Primary School.
- The balance of £9,000 will be awarded to organisations or groups within Hundon. To receive an award from the Community Fund, an application must make a material change or create material benefit for the Community in and around Hundon, and may include revenue items as well as capital payments.
- The minimum award through the Community Fund will be £1,000 as any applicant must demonstrate 'material change' or 'material benefit' for the Community i.e. not narrowly focused or small in size or scope.
- The Community Fund is run by the Community Fund Group who will meet to discuss the merits of each
  application to determine whether or not they qualify for funding and if so how much will be awarded. At any one
  time the Group will consists of four members:
  - 1. The Chairman or Representative of the Parish Council-Geoff Spooner
  - 2. The Chairman or Representative of the Village Hall Committee—Martin Warner

3. One other representative of the Hundon Community with wide knowledge and experience of it – currently David Rowlinson who was Parish Council Chairman when the proposal for Broxted Solar was presented at a meeting which was also attended by Dorothy Whittaker who was Hundon's Borough Council at the time

4. A representative of Navigator Land LLP, the owners of Broxted Estate (and hence landlords of Broxted Solar) – the first such representative being Charles Ryder. David Rowlinson acts as Chairman of the Community Fund Group and Charles Ryder/Navigator Land LLP administers it.

If your club or organisation has a project requiring funding and which meets the above criteria, submit details of what any award will be used for and where it involves the purchase of equipment or services should include more than one quote. Please note that all applications must be for projects which required £1,000 or more and which will be completed within 1 year of receipt of the award.

### Applications should be emailed to Charles Ryder at charles@gbfco.com by 30<sup>th</sup> June.

During the ensuing two weeks, the Community Fund Group will consider the applications seeking, where necessary, further information. The Group will then make recommendations to Broxted Solar as to which applications should be awarded funding and payments are anticipated to be made by the end of August. Depending on that total sum requested from all applications, some which qualify may not receive an award this year, but such projects can apply again next year.

The community Fund Group looks forward to receiving applications in the coming weeks. We very much hope that Broxted Solar's Community Fund will continue to be of great benefit to the Community of Hundon over the coming years.

It is very stimulating to be challenged to take pictures which are outside one's comfort zone. Meetings are informal and friendly (and the social club has a bar!).

#### THE RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS: LONG TO REIGN OVER US

Dear Friends,

The first weekend of June this year marks two significant events.

The first of these is the Queen's platinum Jubilee, for which celebration events are being planned in communities across the country and closer to home in the villages and town which make up our own benefice. These will offer us all the opportunity to meet with friends and neighbours old and new and I hope will draw our communities together.

This is the first time that any British monarch has celebrated a Platinum Jubilee, and after 70 years on the throne very few of us will even be able to remember anything other than living in Elizabethan times.

The Queen's reign has been marked by almost unimaginable changes in society and in the world. Her coronation was credited with kickstarting the television age, now screens are just about everywhere. Her first Christmas broadcast in 1952 was only on the radio, her latest in 2021 could be watched on TikTok or heard on Amazon Alexa!

The Queen has been a constant presence in an ever-changing world and it is testament to her humility and service that, though scandals may have rocked her family and a great number of her governments, the Queen herself remains an inspiration to many.

Though the majority of her coronation was shown on television, there was one moment that was deemed too sacred to broadcast (even that is a decision that you can't imagine television executives making today!), and that was the moment when the symbols of her status – the crimson robe, the diamond diadem, the coronation necklace – were removed, and the Archbishop of Canterbury anointed the new Queen with holy oil.

The Queen has spoken since of how this moment was the most significant one of her life, as in humility she was dedicated to a life of service and called to follow the example of Jesus who himself gave his life for others.

It is fitting then that the other significant celebration taking place on the first weekend on June (5<sup>th</sup> June to be exact) is the feast of Pentecost, this year made even more special as Bishop Martin will be leading our 10.30am service in Cavendish, to which you are all warmly invited. Pentecost is when we remember the gift of God's Holy Spirit to the Church, that Spirit of love and service which binds all people together and fills each and every one of us with the guiding presence of God.

The early Christians, after receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, dedicated their lives to one another. As the Acts of the Apostles puts it, "All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had. God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all that there were no needy persons among them."

As we approach this weekend with its multitude of celebrations, may we all be inspired – whether by the Holy Spirit, by the many years of humble service of her Majesty the Queen, or both – to dedicate our lives to the service of our fellow humans, in our own communities and around the world.


