

HUNDON FRAUD ALERT

Surprisingly, four households in Hundon have suffered identical frauds in the last few weeks. If something similar happens to you or a relative, an immediate response is advisable to save a huge amount of time and inconvenience that could otherwise result.

First a letter arrived, advising of an (unsolicited) new TSB account opened in the householder's name with linked debit card. Soon afterwards a valuable parcel, ordered by the fraudsters using the new account, was intercepted prior to delivery at the entrance to the householder's address. The similarities and closeness of the two events in time and place may indicate a geographic link to this area.

The victims have been unable to work out how the fraudsters obtained their details to open the accounts.

Recommended actions: (1) If you receive notice of an unsolicited account opening, call the issuing bank/building society immediately (things get more complicated the more the fraudsters use the account). (2) Report to Action Fraud (www.actionfraud.police.uk/how-to-reportfraud). (3) Consider having advanced identity protection with the Credit Industry Fraud Avoidance System (CIFAS www.cifas.org.uk/services/identityprotection) as the fraudsters may try to use your details again.



<u>Trig Point -</u> The Trig Point along Chimney Street has been reinstated and freshly painted.

What is a trig point?

Trig points are the common name for "triangulation pillars". These are concrete pillars, about 4' tall, which were used by the <u>Ordnance Survey</u> in order to determine the exact shape of the country. They are generally located on the highest bit of ground in the area, so that there is a direct line of sight from one to the next. By sitting a theodolite (an accurate protractor built into a telescope) on the top of the pillar, accurate angles between pairs of nearby trig points could be measured. This process is called "triangulation".

A major project to map out the shape of Great Britain began in 1936. The network of triangulation pillars, with accurately known positions, led to the excellent OS maps which we enjoy today. The coordinate system used on these maps is known as the "National Grid", and it is essential that you are familiar with this system if you are to get the most of OS maps, or this website. Replacement bin charging

A £30 replacement charge for a stolen, lost or damaged blue or black bin will be introduced from 13 June. Web content will go live on Monday including the FAQs attached.

Charges were in this year's budget setting. This followed a transformation review as the council can no longer absorb the cost of around £100,000 a year for free replacements.

Replacement bins will be supplied with a sticker that can be marked with the house number which will help residents and crews identify where it belongs.

UK Shared Prosperity Fund

WSC have been awarded this as part of the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) that Government announced in April this year to support the implementation of its Levelling Up White Paper.

The fund has two elements:

Multiply – funding to support adult numeracy. This is "to enable all adults without the equivalent of a GCSE Grade C or 4 in maths to be able to access a free flexible course". The lead local authorities for Multiply are county councils and Suffolk County Council has been allocated £3,752,462.

Core UKSPF – where lead local authorities are districts, and from which West Suffolk Council has been allocated \pounds 1,934,467 over three years.

WSC is helping businesses to reduce air pollution they have launched a scheme to become an accredited Clean Air Business thewaytogosuffolk@suffolk.gov.uk

WSC are working on the following to reduce air pollution:

 take direct action: drivers of larger vehicles in our own fleet are given environmental training as part of their professional certification and taxi drivers in West Suffolk work to a policy that has an anti-idling clause.

- The council's vehicle fleet is being upgraded with biodiesel and electric vehicles.
- We are growing the public EV charging infrastructure.
- We raise awareness: For example, winning national recognition for an on-going campaign beginning in 2020 to support schools in tackling anti-idling at drop-off and pick-up times. ALLOTMENT FIELD UPDATE

June is always a busy time on the allotment field with allotment holders trying to keep their crops watered and the weeds under control and our volunteers keeping on top of the grass mowing. Add in the Platinum Jubilee, and it's been an *extremely* busy month! Jubilee



On the Friday of Jubilee weekend, we hosted a plant sale which raised around £400 to be shared between HATA and Hundon Hedgehog Rescue.

This was followed by around 150 people making the most of the sunshine to enjoy a picnic with Pimms. There was a Treasure Hunt for the children, who also helped us build The Queen Elizabeth Bug Hotel. This is designed to form a home or shelter, not just for bugs, but for other critters such as frogs and toads and it was officially opened by John Christophers.

Finally came the celebratory planting of our Jubilee Tree, a beautiful Liquid Amber, kindly donated by the Sicon Foundation. We were delighted that Charles Ryder and David Rowlinson of the Broxted Solar Community Fund, who have also generously supported HATA's activities over the last couple of years, were there to formally plant the tree. Both the tree and the community orchard extension will be registered as part of the Queen's Green Canopy project for Jubilee year.



We would like to thank everybody who supported these events, and we hope you enjoyed them. We are very grateful to those volunteers who helped prepare for and run all the day's activities. 

WEST SUFFOLK LOCAL PLAN – HOUSING DEVELOPMENT UPDATE FROM PARISH COUNCIL – JUNE 2022

As you will be aware from the Hundon Herald articles last year the 'West Suffolk Local Plan' consultation process is currently underway which will determine potential housing needs and housing development options across West Suffolk for the next twenty years.

The first stage of the consultation and call for potential development sites was carried out last year and you will recall that six potential sites around Hundon were offered by local landowners for housing. In response to this many residents submitted comments and the Parish Council completed a 'Housing Needs Survey' to gather future housing requirements, views and concerns to inform their approach to the consultation and any potential development proposals.

We had approximately 200 responses which gave us some broad indicators suggesting that Hundon may benefit from some very limited growth to cater primarily for the elderly looking to downsize or find manageable properties, and first-time buyers.

As anticipated there were firm views against any large scale development on any of the sites, or <u>any</u> housing on the allotment site. Concerns were also expressed that roads, sewage and drainage should be improved before any new housing is considered.

The Parish Council drafted and circulated to all households an initial report on the survey results which included a range of broad principles and objectives that should underpin any future development - both in terms of scale and types of housing - should any sites be allocated by West Suffolk or be bought forward for development. These principles will guide our responses to the next stages of the consultation process.

West Suffolk Local Plan Consultation – 'Preferred Options' – Hundon Sites

West Suffolk have just published their initial response to the first stage of their consultation, and decisions and 'preferred options' for the various sites offered across the whole county - including the six Hundon sites. This provides a second consultation opportunity for communities to be involved with preparation of the Local Plan. This second consultation opportunity is open until July 26th 2022.

Parishioners will see from the website or the summary provided below that <u>none</u> of the sites offered were identified by West Suffolk as 'Preferred Allocations' due to a variety of reasons, and these reasons are also listed below in the **Appendix B Omission Sites** table. This initial decision making by West Suffolk supports the views submitted by residents that any large scale development on any of the sites will be detrimental to the village and environment.

However, as this is the second stage of consultation it is still open to further change should new evidence about the value of potential development on these sites be submitted – and this evidence may be either in their favour or against. It is also possible that new sites may be identified and offered by landowners as part of this next consultation phase and the Parish Council will monitor and keep residents informed.

For these reasons we would encourage residents to submit further comments, either in support or otherwise, of the decisions by West Suffolk to omit these sites from their Preferred Options. Residents may also wish to provide any further evidence that they feel may be beneficial to support officers with their planning decisions.

Part Three: Site Allocations 4.8. Hundon

4.8.1. Hundon is a village located approximately nine kilometres north-east of Haverhill and approximately 18 kilometres south-east of Newmarket, with a population of 1,891 (2019 mid-year estimate). Hundon has a reasonable range of facilities including a primary and pre-school, convenience food shop and leisure facilities.

Constraints and opportunities

- Growth in Hundon is constrained by Lower Road to the south and Mill Road to the north. The southern boundary of the village is subject to an area of flood zone.
- The land in Hundon rises in a northerly direction as the village is situated on the slope of the valley.

- Lower Road forms a boundary to development towards the south and Mill Road to the north.
- The majority of the listed buildings in Hundon line North Street, to the east of the village. A conservation area also covers much of the eastern half of Hundon.
- There are three archaeological sites close to the village. Hundon's historic settlement core centres on Church Street, and North and Lower North Streets. There are traces of an earlier settlement and crop marks around the village which are recorded in the county historic environment record (HER).
- The southern boundary of Hundon village is covered by a flood zone which will prevent any further development in this area. There are significant slopes down to the valley bottom.
- Hundon has reasonable road access to the A143 for Bury St Edmunds and Haverhill, but the highways are lacking in footpaths and are narrow in places.
- Bus services are less frequent than hourly or operate during limited times.

Preferred allocations

- 4.8.2. No new sites have been identified in Hundon due to growth being constrained by the sensitivity of the surrounding landscape, as set out in the West Suffolk Landscape Character Assessment (May 2022). This study identifies Hundon as lying within the Chilton Street farmlands character area, where only small-scale built development is appropriate within the intimate landscape of the valley villages and stream margins. Further information on how housing numbers have been derived can be seen in part one of the local plan.
- 4.8.3. Further information on alternative site options considered but not taken forward can be seen in

the table of omission sites in appendix B.

4.8.4. Information on infrastructure can be seen in the draft infrastructure delivery plan (IDP) (2022) which sets out baseline data for each settlement.

Appendix B - omission sites (see table)

Sites included in the issues and options consultation stage, with reasons for omission from the preferred options consultation document.

- 8.1. As a result of comments received at the issues and options consultation stage and further evidence base work, many sites have now been discounted and are not proposed for allocation in this plan.
- 8.2. These sites are now referred to as 'omission sites' and are set out in the table below, alongside a brief justification setting out why they haven't been selected as a preferred allocation.

8.3. The reasons for omission fall broadly into the following categories:

- Environmental constraints (for example Breckland Special Protection Area (SPA), special areas of conservation (SAC), county wildlife site (CWS), flood zone).
- The site is not available and/or deliverable (either confirmed by the landowner or is in multiple ownership).
- The site is within the settlement boundary and could come forward as windfall development.
- The site has a planning approval and development has commenced or is completed.
- Other available sites are more suitable and sustainable options.


