

Rectors Ramblings - January 2023 (Christmas...the story continues!)

Dear friends.

Well it's January and the celebrations and festivities of Christmas are over..... or are they? While our televisions and supermarkets would have us believe that Christmas ends on 25 December, the Christmas season in the church really only begins on the 25th and then over the coming weeks the readings look at different aspects of the story. The characters of the Nativity story may be familiar to most of us, but what many do not realise is that the Magi (the wise men) are not remembered at Christmas but on a separate festival which falls 12 days after Christmas Day – the Feast of Epiphany. The season of Epiphany then continues until early February so despite the tree being down and the tinsel being in the loft, January is a perfectly appropriate time to be thinking about these Nativity characters.

Not much is known about them, and indeed they are only mentioned in Matthew's Gospel where they are described as wise men from the East who came to Jerusalem. It says that 'when they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts.

In the Bible, the three gifts of the Magi are named but nowhere does it actually say there were only three wise men, in fact in some Christian traditions e.g. the Eastern Syriac Church, they have twelve wise men! But here in the West the tradition continues that there are three and commonly named as Melchior, Caspar, Balthazar.

There have been various things written about them, and very famously T S Eliot wrote a poem called The Journey of the Magi, a reflection written from their perspective. They are perhaps remembered above all for the gifts they offered to Jesus. These weren't random gifts but were deeply symbolic and full of meaning. They offered gold which was associated with kings, showing that Jesus is the king of the world. They brought frankincense which was used in temples, a sign of Jesus' divinity. The last gift was myrrh which was used in burials and was a gift foreshadowing Jesus' death.

As we remember these gifts during the Epiphany season, it is a good opportunity for us to think generally about the idea of gifts. But what makes a good gift? We often narrow our understanding of gifts to physical things - things we want or need, or things others want or need. But we all have gifts: things which we are good at, talents, traits in our personalities, things that come naturally to us. This might be being a talented sports person; it might be being very good at art or music. It might be that we are someone who encourages others. It may be our kindness, our sense of humour, our organisational skills, our ability to empathise. These are gifts that we have to offer to those around us: our family, our friends, our neighbours. Gifts which can contribute to our communities and help build and strengthen relationships.

This season of Epiphany, I'd like to challenge us to think about how we can offer our gifts to others, always remembering that the greatest gift of love and hope found in the baby whom the Magi visited that very first Epiphany. And if you would like to know more about the baby that changed the world, and perhaps you have resolved to start your new year in a new way, why not join us for one of our services across the Benefice, we would love to welcome you.

I wish you all a very Happy New Year and a blessed Epiphany. Mark

Our last meeting saw us trying wines from sunnier climes than ours at the moment – Tasmania.

Alan and Jill, two of our members, who have recently returned from a trip down under, presented some excellent wines.

We started with a fantastic 2017 Riesling from the south of the island, the whole of which we learned is about the size of Ireland! It was a beautiful straw-colour with a fresh tropical aroma. Two more whites followed, an unusual "blanc des noirs" made from Pinot Noir and then a cold climate dry and fresh Chardonnay that was quite dry, unoaked with high acidity. Next two fine reds, an extremely well made, fine Pinot Noir. After this a blend of grapes more often found in southwestern France which was heavy on the tannins and definitely a food wine. To finish we had a rosé fizz from the north coast. A grand tour of the island indeed!

Many thanks to Alan and Jill for providing us with great wines from an unusual region, and for all the research they worked so hard on to ensure such a pleasurable evening.

In December we do not have a meeting, but decamp for our annual dinner.

CLARE CASTLE COUNTRY PARK JANUARY NEWSLETTER

We herald in the new year with two exciting developments at the Park. To mark the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee a local landowner generously gifted Clare Town Council four acres of land adjacent to the Park, to be planted as a commemorative woodland. This area, to be known as Charlie's Meadow, has now begun its transformation from arable land to woodland. The first 450 native saplings were planted on a bright and breezy winter's day, with more to follow.

This is very much a legacy project for our children and grandchildren and it was fitting that the first trees were planted by students from Stour Vallev Community School's eco club. Many thanks to Rowan and fellow students (pictured), and to all the other volunteers who helped. If you're interested in helping



with future tree plantings please let us know.

The other development has been the completion of a scale recreation of the station complex at Clare in "N gauge", complete with working trains. Whether you're a railway buff or not, this intricate recreation of the 1950s station is a fascinating glimpse into our recent past. The model is in our visitor centre in the former south platform waiting room. Open at weekends from 11 till 3 (and on Fridays other than in winter), the centre is well worth a visit for the model railway, a fascinating film about the history and ecology of the Park, and a great selection of local walks, among much else.

Clare's station is unique in that it's the only surviving Great Eastern Railway "1865 type" station with a full complement of railway buildings. Thanks to the generosity of donors we were recently able to reinstate the "Clare" sign on the



south platform and hope to be able to replace the other missing sign on the north platform (shown in the attached image of the station in its heyday) sometime this year.

Whether your interest is in the railway, the site's Norman history or the Park's ecology - or simply coffee and cake at Platform One café and a relatively mud free dog walk - our Park has so much to offer, even in the depths of winter.




