

<u>Highways</u> – Please keep reporting any potholes or highways issues via the reporting tool, details above. Cllr B Bennett reported that the new Highways contract will be with Milestone from October 2023.

<u>Coronation</u> – If any organisations are interested in working with the Parish Council to support an event to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III, please email the Parish Clerk at <u>clerk.hundonpc@outlook.com</u>.

Plans continue for the Street Party to celebrate the Coronation. This will be held in North Street, outside the Rose and Crown. A road closure will be in place.

<u>War Memorial</u> – The final phase of the war memorial refurbishment, putting down resin bonded gravel, will be completed when weather improves.

<u>Alternative Fuel Payments</u> - The Alternative Fuel Payment (AFP) is a government scheme which offers payments of £200 to households that use alternative fuels to the gas grid as their main source of heating.

Most households on alternative fuels will have already received this payment through their electricity supplier in

February. But there are a small number of households that don't have a direct contract with an electricity supplier so they will need to make a claim under the **AFP Alternative Funding** scheme.

The government has advised that provided they can provide sufficient proof of address, receipt of fuel costs, and are not otherwise ineligible, households eligible for AFP Alternative Fund.

Can residents' qualify for this and the Energy Bills Support Scheme?

Yes, although if they aren't receiving the money for the schemes automatically, then they will need to submit separate claims.

How do people make a claim for AFP Alternative Funding?

People will need to submit a claim on the Government website at <u>https://www.gov.uk/apply-alternative-fuel-bill-support-if-not-automatic</u>

There is also a government helpline open from 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday for anyone who requires help and support to make a claim or progress a claim. The helpline number is **0808 175 3287.**

The government's Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ) will then carry out checks to confirm that the households isn't on the gas grid and hasn't received a payment through their electricity supplier. West Suffolk Council and Anglia Revenues Partnership will then complete final checks and make payments.

Applications will close on 31 May 2023.

<u>Hundon Music Festival Committee</u> – A grant of £1,000 has been awarded to Hundon Festival Committee to support the free music festival in the summer.

Voter ID

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023.

Which forms of ID can I use to vote? You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional license)
- Blue badge
- Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- Biometric Immigration document
- Defence identity card
- Certain national identity cards

BROXTED SOLAR COMMUNITY FUND FOR HUNDON APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING – 2023

If your club or Organisation has a project requiring funding and which meets the following criteria please apply as detailed below. The closing date for applications is May 31st.

The main features of the Community Fund are summarised: -

- The total awarded will be £10,500. This will include a direct annual payment of £1,500 to Hundon School.
- The balance of £9,000 will be awarded to organisations or groups within the parish of Hundon.
- To receive an award from the Community Fund, an application must make a material change or create material benefit for the Community in and around Hundon, and may include revenue items as well as capital payments.
 - The minimum award through the Community Fund will be £1,000 as any applicant must demonstrate 'material change' or 'material benefit' for the Community i.e. not narrowly focused or small in size or scope. Inevitably, not all applications will be successful.

The Community Fund is run by the Community Fund Group consisting of four members:

- The Chairman or Representative of the Parish Council currently Geoff Spooner. The Chairman of the Village Hall currently Chris Callow.
- One other representative of the Hundon Community with wide knowledge and experience of it the first such representative member being David Rowlinson.
- A representative of Navigator Land LLP, the owners of Broxted Estate (and hence landlords of Broxted Solar) the first such representative being Charles Ryder.


David Rowlinson acts as Chairman of the Community Fund Group and Charles Ryder/ Navigator Land LLP administers it.

Applications should be emailed to Charles Ryder at charles@gbfco.com by 31st May.

Applications should either be sent in the form of a brief but succinct note or by way of a brief business plan together with costings and where necessary, comparative quotes. Please note that all applications must be for projects which require £1,000 or more. During the two weeks following the deadline, the Community Fund Group will consider the applications, seeking where necessary, further information. (Sadly not all applications will be successful but such projects can apply in the following year.) The Group will then make recommendations to Broxted Solar as to which applications should be awarded funding and payments are anticipated to be made by early/mid July.

The Community Fund Group looks forward to receiving applications in the coming weeks. Among the many beneficiaries are the Primary School, Pre-school, All Saints Church, Village Hall Cinema, Village Fete, Football Club, Cricket Club, Allotment Club, Gardening Club, W.I., Hedgehog Rescue, War Memorial Refurbishment etc.

If you have an idea which you think might benefit the community why not apply - it could be on this list next year!

Allotment Field Update

What with all the snow and the rain, it's been a difficult start to the allotment calendar, but we keep our fingers crossed that things improve. It's nice to see the early spring flowers and hear more from the birds. Please be aware that they're starting to nest now and don't do any more hedge trimming.

The Ditch and the Chilton Brook

Having no drainage experts on our team, we were pleased to secure a site visit from the Suffolk County Council Flood and Water team to advise us on the state of these two watercourses. A team of us from HATA, the Rogeron Trust and the Parish Council, were delighted to have confirmed that water is flowing well down both the ditch and through our stretch of the Chilton Brook. We were advised to increase the depth of a short stretch from the lower Rogeron Close bridge down to the corner, which has now been done, but other than that everything is behaving as it should. We were relieved that no drastic work is needed on the stretch of ditch from the allotment field corner to Lower Road, as this would have been extremely damaging to wildlife and required the temporary closure of the footpath. In actual fact, our adviser told us the growth in the lower ditch will probably be slowing down the water flow into the Brook, which is helpful in heavy rain.

Now that we understand how best to manage the watercourses to avoid increasing the flood risk on Lower Road, we hope to have a further visit from the Essex Rivers Trust (Chilton Brook is a tributary of the Stour) accompanied by the Environment Agency, who we hope can advise us on managing our watercourses in the most wildlife-sensitive manner.

Queen's Green Canopy

This nationwide initiative was created to mark the Platinum Jubilee and has resulted in over a million trees planted in Her Majesty's name across the nation. In the relevant period (October 2022 – March 2023) HATA and the allotment holders have planted in excess of 75 trees. This brings the total number of trees planted on the allotment field since HATA took over the management of the field in July 2021 to more than 100.



The local charity which has supplied all these trees has recently had to announce it is ceasing operation due to a change in ownership of its key donor, Sicon. This is obviously disappointing, but we are grateful for their support in helping us transform the allotment field.

Hundon Ecochurch

Through our links with Risby Wildlife-friendly Village, we were able to introduce the Risby Ecochurch leader to the Hundon church wardens, and they have just announced their Bronze Award. We look forward to continuing to work with the church in making the village even more friendly to the wildlife we share it with.

RECTORS RAMBLINGS – APRIL 2023 (THE LEAST OF THESE)

Dear Friends,

As we approach Easter, we are reminded of the greatest act of love and sacrifice that ever took place in human history. It is a time for us to reflect on the true meaning of Easter once again and to think about what it means for us as individuals and as a community.

For many of us, Easter is a time of celebration, marked by family gatherings, perhaps an Easter egg hunt, and, I hope a church service *(for services in your parish church visit www.stourvalley.org.uk)* But as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we must also remember the teachings of Jesus and his message of love and compassion, as it says in Matthew 25:40 "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me".

In this benefice, we are fortunate to have a strong sense of community, and we strive to extend that sense of community to those who may be less fortunate than ourselves, as we have seen in how many opened their homes to those fleeing the war in Ukraine. This Easter, we have an opportunity to extend that sense of community to migrants and refugees who are seeking a safe haven, and better life here in the UK, remembering that many have made dangerous journeys to get here and now are faced with difficult and uncertain futures.

As your Rector, I have over the years seen first-hand the struggles that many refugees and migrants face when they arrive here. Many have left their homes and families behind, hoping for safety from persecution, protection from conflict, and ultimately share the life that we so easily take for granted. Sadly, all too often they are met with hostility and insecurity upon arrival. Many will face discrimination, language barriers, and a lack of resources and practical support. But as Christians, we are called to unconditionally love our neighbours as ourselves, and to care for the least of these among us. This Easter, I encourage all of us to reflect on how we can extend that love and care to our neighbours wherever they have come from or how they have arrived.

One way we can do this is by reaching out and offering our support. This could mean volunteering at a local organisation that works to support refugees and migrants, donating resources or funds to support those in need, or simply offering a listening ear to someone who may be struggling.

We can also work to educate ourselves and others about the challenges that refugees and migrants face, and to advocate for policies and practices that promote justice and equality for all. This could mean attending a community event or discussion, writing to local officials or MPs to express our concerns, or simply engaging in respectful dialogue with those who may hold different views. Ultimately, our goal should be to create a welcoming and inclusive community for all, regardless of their background or circumstances.

As we celebrate Easter and the message of love and compassion that it represents, let us work towards a more just and equitable society, pray for peace in places of conflict, and help make a world where there is no need for anyone to leave their homes and families to be safe and secure.

May I wish you all a peaceful Easter.



TOURS OF CLARE 2023

Our team of 8 Clare Tour Guides commences its second season at the start of April. 90 minute tours of Clare will start at 2pm from the Visitor Centre in the Park every Saturday and on selected bank holidays (there are a lot of bank holidays in April and May this year!).

The tours follow the route of the Town Trail, taking in the town's main heritage assets, including the castle, railway heritage, market, River Stour and Clare Priory. Also included are the key listed buildings: with over 130 in the town there is only time to look at those that really stand out architecturally or because of their history. The tours cover '900 years of history in 90 minutes' and as such balance the influence of the de Clare family in medieval times with the story of the wool industry and the economic and social history of the town.

Clare's heritage assets are unique, for instance in having listed railway buildings inside the bailey of a medieval castle, and having the mother house in England of the Austin Friars (the Augustinian Order) since 1248. Whilst the buildings speak for themselves, a key emphasis of the tours is on the stories of the people who lived in them over the centuries, including Cecily of York (mother of Edward 1V and Richard 111), Henry V111's physician, the author C P Snow, and the 'real-life' model for Dickens' Scrooge. In all, the tours seek to inform, educate and entertain, but with a light touch non-academic approach. "I never knew that" is a typical comment from locals who attended a tour last year and feedback from the 2022 season was extremely positive. So, being a local is not a reason for non-attendance!

Separate private tours for such organisations as WIs, U3A and history societies are very welcome. These can, by arrangement, be on any day of the week, and can be accented towards topics of particular interest.

The tours, which cost £5 per person, can be booked at

<u>www.claretourguides.co.uk</u> or at the Visitor Centre in the Park. The distance covered in the 90 minutes is less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles so the pace is very relaxed, and the route, despite crossing roads several times in the centre of the Town, is wheelchair accessible.


