We are all aware of the amazing work that our volunteers do to make our shop the success and vital resource for the village that is. Opening the shop and sorting the newspapers and early deliveries, manning the till, stocking the shelves etc. All very visible roles. There is also a lot of work that goes on in the background unseen. Not least of this is the role of the shop's treasurer. The treasurer pays the suppliers, has dealt with wages, pays the electricity, equipment, and all other costs. They also keep a running set of accounts, calculate weekly sales, ensures that VAT is paid to the inland revenue and prepare the end of year accounts for the independent auditor. For the last seventeen and a half years the shop has been blessed to have Bernard Beer acting as its Treasurer. During 2023 Bernard informed the committee that he would like to retire from this position and asked that we begin the process of finding his replacement. That process is now complete and Bernard will step down as treasurer at the end of March. The committee, and I am sure those from previous committees, are eternally grateful for the time and work that Bernard has given to ensuring the success and longevity of Hundon Village Shop, for his diligence in taking care of the finances for so many years and for his wisdom as a committee member.

We are delighted to announce that Barry O'Leary has agreed to join the shop committee and to succeed Bernard as treasurer. Barry is a qualified accountant by profession ensuring that the shops finances will continue to be in safe hands.

We are in that betwixt and between time of year. Still in the midst of winter with the chance of storms, gales, rain, and cold but with thoughts turning to the warmer and calmer weather which should not be too far around the corner now. Here at the shop, we are trying to cover all of these seasons for you. For the here and now we have smokeless coal, firelighters, and candles and for the just around the corner compost and early season bedding plants should be with us soon.

We are now very much in the build-up for Easter which this year is at the end of March. Hot Cross buns and Easter themed cards will be on sale throughout this period.

Rector's Ramblings – March 2024 (Spring Blossoms and Rising Hope)

As the crisp winter air begins to soften and delicate hues of green peek through the hedgerows, our hearts turn towards the promise of spring and the joy of Easter. Here in Suffolk, with its patchwork fields and picturesque villages, this season holds a special resonance. 

Local Author has Debut Novel Published and Submitted to Hollywood!

Tony Eaton has lived in Hundon for over twenty years. He is probably best known as being part of the rock 'n' roll band *Jurassic Rock* and for being the husband of Sue, a well known local artist.

In January 2023, *Sky-in-the-Eye* came to Tony in a dream while he was being treated for cancer. The following year was spent writing and having it critiqued and edited.

Faces of Hundon

Not just faces, but feet too - as this month we meet Alison Law and some of the dancers from The Ballet Shoe Workshop.



Alison Law moved to Hundon with her parents when she was 13, and has been dancing since she was about 8, studying at the José Titlow school of dancing, and then the Jandor in Cambridge. She set up The Ballet Shoe Workshop in Hundon, in 1992, after earning her teaching qualification, starting with just 10 students:

only taught ballet, but a few years later I qualified in freestyle and classes really picked up. There was a lot more interest on the freestyle side, now it's about equal - but the majority of children that do ballet also do freestyle, it's their choice, but I don't have many that do just ballet or just freestyle.

We do an annual Christmas performance, which is a story that we write each year, and that's done at the Arts Centre in Haverhill, just purely because this stage [Hundon Village Hall] is not big enough for the number of children, and plus there really isn't anywhere to get changed anymore. Twice a year we have exam sessions, in March and in June, when IDTA examiners come to examine the children to a set syllabus, and then we have a Summer presentation in July which is usually when they get their awards and certificates, but in terms of a big performance we only set one a year. Sometimes we get invited to Fétes, which the children love to perform at.

The most important thing to me is the enthusiasm of the children, and the parents, their input, especially at Christmas show time just keeps me and my daughter going. My daughter helps me write the stories for the Christmas shows - so that's one of my favourite things about the year. The exams are nice because the children have something to work towards and it's a goal they set themselves, so it's good personal achievement, but the Christmas show, they just bring it alive, they

really do, it's fabulous to watch - especially the little 3 year olds when they're doing the finale - they sing their hearts out, and they must be absolutely shattered, because they've done one show on Saturday, and the two on the Sunday, and some of them are only 3. Without the children's enthusiasm, and the parent's, it wouldn't be anything. So that's really a favourite time of the year.

I would like to mention my parents, only because without them it wouldn't have happen, firstly from them sending me to dance when I was younger, but secondly, up until Covid they helped me every single Wednesday, and every single Saturday. Especially my mum, Jean. Covid has made me come in to this century, so I've had to do more things online, but before, she'd be writing out the receipts, doing the admin, and helping all the parents with shoes, and sewing, and that sort of thing. I wouldn't know one end of the needle from the other, so her and my sister have made costumes, and my Dad, Roy, used to make all the props. Covid forced them to take a bit of a backseat, but I would like to mention them, and also my daughter, Stephanie. She started dancing with me when she was 3, went off to university, came back for a couple of years, and now is up North, but again, without her help, especially at Christmas show time, when I 'm having a melt-down, usually over something technical, she'll be on the end of the phone helping me dissect what I think is a massive issue. Again, I don't know how I'd cope, so my family are really, really important to me, and have supported me throughout this. Even my husband and son, though they haven't been a part of it, they know Wednesday and Saturdays don't exist in our household - without them supporting that, it wouldn't happen. 99



I caught up with some of the Wednesday students for a brief chat before their class started. Nirvana suggested someone had been dancing for 300 years! but most of the girls I spoke to today were 7 years old and had been dancing for about 4 years. The favourite dance move in this class was definitely the Pony Gallops, which was elegantly demonstrated by a couple of students, while Daphne told us she likes the energetic warm-ups, and Luna likes the skipping best. Daisy has been dancing since she was 3 years old, and says that it's really fun and hopes to be a dancer when she's older.



Our Junior Journalist, Holly Proud, interviewed some of the Ballet School Workshop students in between their Saturday morning classes:

or Wednesday evening, you'll notice lots of cars in the car park, and lots of people going in and out. You might be wondering why this is. If you didn't already know, I can tell you that it's because of the Ballet Shoe Workshop, a school for children and young people who love to dance.

I went to this dance school myself when I was six and I loved it! But we thought that you would be interested in learning more about it from some of the dancers who go there now. I met with them on a Saturday morning and talked to them about what it's like to go there.

First of all, I spoke to Willow, Katie, and Katie's younger sister Hannah; aged 12, 13, and 10. I asked them what types of dances they do at the BSW and they all replied Ballet and Freestyle. Surprisingly none of them live in the village, so I asked why they chose to come to a dance school in Hundon instead of one more local in their area? Willow told me that her friend had recommended it to her, and Katie and Hannah told me that they had heard good things about it too. I also asked if they liked the village hall to dance in and they said yes.

I interviewed Quinn and Ivy next, both aged 10, and I was quite surprised to find out that Ivy had been coming to the BSW since she was 3! She told me that her mum put her in because she thought that she would enjoy it, and she has been going ever since. Quinn has been going for 3 years.

At the Ballet Shoe Workshop they do big performances in front of the parents, grandparents and anyone who wants to come and support, so I was interested to know if the students enjoyed showing off what they had been choreographing and practicing all year. I'm pleased to tell you that all of the dancers said (with great enthusiasm) that they did!

Lastly, I talked to 8-year-old Poppy. Poppy says that she really enjoys coming to dance because she loves to see her friends and she loves to dance. She lives in Hundon so it is a lot easier and quicker to come to dance on a Saturday morning, she also likes Hundon because she has a nice friend group here and I'm sure that because it is a small village they can get together quite often. Poppy likes doing the big shows for parents as well and she seemed very happy and cheerful when I interviewed her, which is always good to see!

I found it very interesting to hear about what The Ballet Shoe Workshop was like and how the dancers enjoyed it, and I hope you did as well! So, next time you pass the village hall on a Wednesday or Saturday you know that it is the day that the dancers are in there practicing their routines. And, if you know any children who love dance, you know where to go! 99







The Park is a delight at any time of the year, but it has a special magic in spring, when signs of new life are all around us. Snowdrops abound on the motte, and other woodland flowers bloom before the trees come into leaf and shade them out.



On the theme of new beginnings, we are hosting a number of new activities in the Park this year, as well as seeing the return of some old favourites. On 9th March we welcome Wonky Wheel Makers' Market to the Old Goods Shed for the first time, for a day of fine art and contemporary crafts. The following Saturday, 16th March, is an opportunity to don walking boots and head out into the countryside for a gentle 4.5m walk from the Park with Clare Walks Group. We round off the month with our ever popular Easter trail, which runs from 29th March to 7th April.

Other new activities for the year include folk music, art workshops, a ceramics exhibition, orienteering for all ages, a very special Harry Potter challenge, painting in the park, brass on the grass with the Melford Silver band and a day of dragonflies, pond-life and mini beasts. addition we have numerous "pre-loved" activities planned, from guided historical tours, outdoor theatre and art exhibitions to children's trails and crafts, walks, vintage car meets, Party in the Park, community information events and more.

On Saturday 20th April we'll be opening the Old Goods Shed from 11am to 12.30pm for a volunteer information event. If you're interested in the Park and how it is run, do come along to 23

The Old Goods Shed



"What Mrs Vera Cutts Remembers"


During a 1989 Village Study of Hundon, I asked Vera Cutts (who, at the time of the interview, had lived in Hundon for 62 years) what she remembered about growing up in Hundon:

66 I remember there being at least ten shops. There was the Cobblers, which was on the left of the workhouse yard, the Newsagents, the Watchmakers, and the Butchers. The Coal Merchant lived on Lower Road, in the house which is now called Oak Cottage. There was also a Cycle Shop, a General Stores, a Bakers, which baked his bread in a faggots oven. The Bakers was opposite the Garage, which wasn't there at the time. At the bottom of Steeplechase was a shop called Smiths Corner Shop. There was also a Post Office which was run by my Mother. She was First World War Post Mistress for sixty five years. The Mace and Post Office which are in the village now (1989), were not there then. The Butcher used to slaughter his own cattle, and one day I heard him crying for help. Someone went to find out why and it was because one of his cows had pinned him up against his wall. He was rescued but did not live for very long afterwards, and soon died. He had been crushed as he was pinned against the wall.

A horse and cart used to come and take your tins that you didn't need any more. The rubbish tip for them was where two houses have recently been built. It was called Depples Rubbish Tip and was somewhere on the Lower Road. You also had a Milk Cart, but it was not driven by a horse. The cart was petrol driven and the dairy men were called Mr Parks and Mr Obells. The post was sorted in Hundon and then delivered by people on bikes, and on Christmas Eve you used to get given drinks at almost every house you delivered to. One young man went slightly queer and fell in the river. All his mail was drenched and somebody had to rescue all of the mail and deliver the remaining parcels and letters. He was cleaned up and taken home. The Post Office had to be told he was ill, otherwise he would have lost his job.



Hundon had its water supply next to the Church, on the pavement. It was a water wheel and standpipe and that is where the villagers got their water from. We were quite lucky and had our own well, which we got our washing water from. It was in our garden. If you didn't have a phone there was always one in the Post Office that my Mother ran. One day a man complained to us because his conversation was overheard. My Mother said it was pretty hard for the customers not to hear if he was going to use the village phone and he should get his own if he was so worried about his phone calls being overheard. Hundon didn't have electricity until about forty years ago.

I have heard people today say that there was not a Blacksmith in our village and I would reply "Rubbish, my Grandfather used to be the village Blacksmith up at Hundon Hall corner. We used to go and watch him at work."

A lot of roads and streets were named after farms and people who had done a lot for Hundon, so in a way they were Hundon's famous people. Today's famous person is Michael Chinery, the Broadcaster and Naturalist who lives down Windmill Rise at the house called Mousehole. I expect he chose the name for it. Windmill Rise is called Windmill Rise because there used to be a windmill there. It isn't there any more. Rogerons Close was named after Thomas Rogeron, and Armstrong Close was named after Winifred Armstrong, daughter of the Reverend at that time. Winifred was also a very good Councillor.

The Organ in the Church used to be pumped at the back, and my Mother used to pump the organ. Now the organ is run by electricity. I remember that not long ago a young man came to Hundon and was fascinated by it. He said "What is a fine organ like this doing in this little village church?" He wanted to play the organ very much.

Another thing that surprised a visitor is our porch. Our Church was the only Church for miles around that had a Galilee porch.

I remember there being a great large fire in Hundon church. It was in the middle between the two doors, the North door and the South door. The only trouble with this was when it was windy the heat went out through the other door, and so it didn't really keep the Church very warm. Now the Church has electric heating and it keeps the Church warmer.



There were a lot of pubs in Hundon then. There was the Red House, The Cock, (which was pulled down along with Chocks Farm and about three houses when Stradishall airfield was made in the Second Word War. It could not be called Hundon airfield because it sounded too much like Hendon airfield, and the pilots would have been confused). The White Horse, Red Lion, Thatchers Cottage (which was really a brew house), The Three Horses, The Rose and Crown, The Plough, The Shovel (which didn't start off as the Shovel), and a lot more.



There were more amenities then than there are now. The building next to Mace used to be a Billiard room and Reading room. Quite a lot of people used to go there and while the men played billiards the ladies read books.



The Village Hall was built by voluntary workers and took three years to build. It was opened in the early 1950s. It was blessed by the Vicar and it was opened with a whist drive and dance. The buses were more frequent then and the population was less. The War Memorial was moved about 30 years ago from the bottom of North Street to the Church Yard.

The fields used to be cut by binders and then Horse and Carts took the bundles away. It used to be fun playing in the fields and on the bundles.

I remember an old lady who lived in the village and was slightly deaf. My Mother once sent me with a telegram to give her. When I arrived she was playing the piano and had her hearing aid turned off. I tapped on the window but she didn't hear me. In the end she turned around, she must have noticed my shadow. When she answered the door she asked if I liked the piece. I said yes and she told me that she would play it every time I came over to see her. One day she bought out some warm bread and thickly spread it with peanut butter. I didn't like it and hoped that she wouldn't give it to me any more.

People were more friendly then, and always used to talk to you as you walked down the streets. I think it was nicer then, even though you had to work harder. People never grumbled then and you nearly all lived very happily. It was quite a thriving village even though the population is more now. 99
